Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence Issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.

- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employed
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A
 (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
 with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
 reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
 decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and



f) Proposed Operating Schedule.

Having considered the current application and the operating schedule put forward by the applicant, the Licensing Authority believes that, if the application were granted, the wording set out in the operating schedule, is sufficiently precise to enable it to form clear enforceable licence conditions in accordance with section 18(2)(a) of the Licensing Act.

The Police have submitted a letter of representation in relation to the application. The representation requests that additional conditions be attached to the licence in relation to CCTV should the application be granted. The representation also seeks clarification of the measures that are to be used to manage access to alcohol by customers who may be shopping at the premises outside the hours sought for the sale of alcohol. Given that the application requests unrestricted opening hours for the premises, the licensing authority also requests clarification as to how the operator intends to manage that potential situation.

Further representation has been received from other persons, which sets out their concerns regarding the application. The subcommittee will have to be satisfied that granting the application will not undermine the licensing objectives.

If the application is granted, I believe it would be appropriate to replace statement b)1 of the operating schedule with the conditions 1 – 6 requested by the Police in their letter of representation dated the 13th of December 2017.

An application for planning permission is currently being processed for the development. Whilst the planning process is an entirely separate regime involving different considerations, the applicant is reminded that should a terminal hour condition be attached to any permission granted which is more restrictive than those attached to the premises licence if granted, then the operator will need to observe the earliest closing time specified within either permission.

These representations have been prepared on the 22nd of December 2017 with the benefit of viewing the original application and representations received by that date.

Further to the above application.

I wish to protest on the following grounds:

- 1. There are already six outlets in the area already selling alcohol eg, Sycamore Stores, St David's University College Students Union Bar, The Friends Arms, The Poplars, Spar in Johnstown, and the Athletic Club. There is also a 7th premises selling alcohol nearby within walking distance "The Dairies Club".
- 2. There are children in the area who are playing, and we have already had instances of people in broad daylight over indulging. One instance in particular two gentlemen, aged between 40 and 70 who were worse for wear, and used a 90 year old neighbour's wall to urinate in broad daylight in front of children who were playing in the area.
- 3. We do not need the resultant debris that individuals who are not compliant with putting their rubbish in the bins provided, leaving cans, bottles etc lying around or being thrown into gardens.
- 4. The Estate has always been of good character and reputation for the past 51 years and we do not wish to encourage this behaviour in our area.
- 5. The provision of a drinks licence will also put a lot of business (ie especially the public houses who are already struggling) out of business. Thus resulting in unemployment. This will also happen in the two local mini-markets who may even have to close because of this development.
- 6. There are children playing all the time on the estate, some as young as four, they do not need to see the behaviour of unscrupulous drinkers, or their actions.
- 7. In order to enter the proposed premises these large lorries will have to swing out taking up all the road, and on a bend.
