They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.



f) Proposed Operating Schedule.

The subcommittee will have to be satisfied that granting the application will not undermine the licensing objectives.

The Environmental Health representation requests that the applicant outlines how they intend to manage the premises to ensure that it does not impact negatively on its neighbours.

Following a brief meeting at the premises on the 7th of March 2018 you forwarded the attached list of control measures. I would also be grateful if you could forward a copy of your response to the Environmental Health representation in advance of the application being considered by committee.

If the application is granted, I believe it would be appropriate to replace all the statements made in the operating schedule with conditions numbered 1 -22, requested by the Police along with the control measures outlined in the attached document.

- 6. It must record at a minimum of 12 images per second.

- 12. The system must incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be played back on any Microsoft Windows or MAC compatible computer. The application software required to launch and view recorded

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images must either be included as part of the standard operating system installed or be installed to the recorded media when the data is copied to that media.

14. Door Supervisors to be on duty whenever the premises are open after 23.00hrs and from 20.00hrs on Friday and Saturday nights.

Door Supervisors to be on duty before 23.00hrs on specific days such as Boxing Day, New Year's Eve and Bank Holiday Sundays. Also whenever live major sporting events take place.

When employed Door Supervisors must be registered with the SIA, to be on duty until the time that all members of the public have left the premises.



To whom it may concern,

I am writing regarding the application for premises license for Jackson's Wine Bar. I am the owner of Caffi lechyd Da which is diagonally opposite the entrance to Jackson's wine bar on Jackson's Lane.

My business has been here for many years and though we are a fully licensed premises we are a restaurant so we open in the evening for dinner service, special events, poetry and spoken word events, local book launches, talks and acoustic music events.

The focus is very much on food and entertainment and we have always had absolutely zero problems with noise or disorderly behaviour, none whatsoever, because of the type of events we hold and the customer base that we attract.

However, in the past when the old Jackson's wine bar was open we had a lot of problems with noise, disturbance and drunk aggressive very undesirable people. The door staff of the wine bar would eject customers into the street and they would then cause a problem trying to get into my restaurant/ being aggressive and noisy outside - as it is so close, just further down the alley and obviously this is detrimental to my business - if you can imagine this sort of behaviour when people are sitting having a quiet meal or during a storytelling event or similar?

Since the closure of the original wine bar it has been a huge relief for my business and the general area feels more civilised and a safe environment in the late evening. I am glad to see a venue in Carmarthen being regenerated and wish any new business owner the very best of luck in a new venture, however I am very worried that the wrong sort of business could really damage the reputation and feel of the whole area. If the premises license goes ahead I would want to see much more control over the way that the customers behave - Jackson's used to be known for selling cheap strong drinks and the

customers tended to behave accordingly. As a personal license holder myself and having run bars, pubs and hotels I see no reason why customers should be leaving a premises in a drunk and aggressive condition, they should never be allowed to get into that sort of state in the first place. I also strongly feel that the music that used to be played in that premises under previous ownership was much too loud and strongly impacted my business so I feel that some kind of sound proofing is a problem that needs to be addressed as, quite apart from my own problems this is also a residential area.

I hope that the reopening of the wine bar will prove a positive impact in regenerating the area however I will be very disappointed if the evening trade that I am building is destroyed so that we can go back to a few years ago when I would be having to clear vomit off my doorstep, reattach signs, and struggle to eject unwanted drunken people from my evening events.

So we have a sophisticated alarm system and grill fitted to the window and door. Before the wine bar closed we had two problems, firstly the behaviour of the people who have been Drinking, then leaving the premises are rowdy and even frightening for the people who use this busy thoroughfare, this certainly dosent help our business when people are viewing Our shop window and entering and leaving the shop.

Secondly our night time alarm was constantly activated by rowdy behaviour, people fighting, banging on and bumping inot the door and window protective grills, so much so That police response was withdrawn, which affected our insurance policy hugely We live in Saundersfoot and other key holders who may respond to the alarm live too far away. I can assure you, to be called to Jacksons lane late at night is extremly intimidating. We live in dread of this reopening and all this occurring again.

I am writing to express my concerns regarding a Premises Notice at a property in Jackson's Lane (formerly known as Jacksons Wine Bar), <u>Carmarthen</u> SA31 1QD, applied for by a Jasmine Louise Thomas

I was very distressed when I came across the licence notice on the Wine Bar door, as I, nor any other local residents or businesses had been personally notified by letter drop. I did not see anything in the local paper, the Carmarthen Journal, either.

This property has been closed for a few years and it is with great concern that I see an application for a Premises License for alcohol has been submitted to the council.

The hours of opening applied for are 12 to 23.00 Sunday to Wednesday and 12 to 01.00 Thursday to Saturday, giving half an hour to empty the premises after last sale of alcohol. This is 7 days a week during sleeping hours of surrounding residents.

I am a tenant proximity. It will be a great detriment to my home life and quality of life if they are to open under these conditions.

I am particularly concerned as I have multiple chronic health conditions that keep meat from the majority of the time, and weekends in this area are already problematic.

There are several residential properties in the area, who's inhabitants include children.

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and kicked every weekend. Regardless of the shutters the shops require to protect their properties, these are always smashed aggressively by large crowds. There are frequent fights and worrying instances of violence. The wine bar door happened to be kicked in so severely recently that it still has not been replaced. A shop around the corner also had it's window smashed in the last few months.

The lane is used as a shortcut through town by everyone, but on weekends is used as a public toilet, with people urinating and vomiting on a regular basis. It is also used to take numerous drugs, and lewd behaviour seems to be a natural occurrence. It is also a danger with smashed glass throughout the evening, which the cleaning van does not always manage to pick up.

A lamp post was recently put up a after a complaint to act as a deterrent, but unfortunately has not seemed to stop anyone.

The Carmarthen town is a very attractive area until the weekends. This addition will only serve to make the risk to property worse and disturbance to residents unbearable.

There are already a large number of bars in the area, making me wonder about the cumulative limit. One in particular has very loud music that I believe goes over the decibel limit, as my property vibrates and hums throughout the time they have music playing.



Complaints of high levels of noise, broken bottles, anti-social, violent and nuisance behaviour from customers, including lewd acts and urination in the lane from people spilling out from what was an outside area and the alarm constantly going off were very much a concern and many of these incidents were passed onto the police in the past.

It will make my flat and others homes a very difficult place to live, particularly for me as such an ill person who often can't go out and needs to rest due to my poor health.

The noise of the bottle disposal in the early hours and the delivery of barrels to surrounding bars can still be heard from my home, all of which contribute to extreme levels of noise at unsociable hours for residents. This premises the surrounding bars can still be too much.

Although still not safe or clean, there has been improvement since the closure of Wine Bar. Reopening would change this fact, when there were hopes of further improvement with the planned rejuvenation of the Shopper's Garden area.

Any tenant would be unhappy, but as I spend more time in my home than most people, I would be grateful if you could please consider all I have said.

I have viewed the proposed licence for myself, and although it has been noted that care will be taken in respect of residents, this has never been adhered to in the past.

The late hours of opening and noise would interfere with anybody's enjoyment of living here.

Can you please accept this letter as a strong challenge to the granting of this license and the hours applied for as it will directly impact on the Licensing objectives, Prevention of Crime, disorder, public safety and nuisance and to resident's safety.

I request that you please ensure my identity and anything that could allude to my identity be kept anonymous for fear of any reprisal. Many thanks.
