	Bethesda Congregational Church Tumble
Project Description	The Church is utilised on a regular basis and provides religious services, Sunday school activities, thanksgiving, weddings, funeral services, baptism, and St David's Day concert, also Christmas nativity play and carol services.
	The venue is strongly supported by Tumble Primary School and Mynydd Mawr Choir who practise there twice a week, whilst also supporting non-religious events such as regular coffee mornings, encouraging the community to utilise the building.
	<ol> <li>The project idea centres upon the installation of a more economical condensing boiler and new safe bunded oil tanks for the chapel and vestry.</li> <li>With an ageing congregation, there is the need to improve visual communication methods within the chapel so that they marry up to the loop system installed last year.</li> </ol>
	This project is for the required repairs, in line with the surveyors report, along with the installation of an upgraded sound system, which will greatly improve the audio reproduction throughout the church. Incorporating a loop system that will relay the output of the sound system to any person wearing a hearing aid fitted with a coupler.
	The report also states that the condition of the chapel boiler is old and inefficient and the latest service report notes that the tank does not comply with current regulations and that the location of the storage tank presents a potential fire hazard.
	This work will ensure that the building is fit for purpose and improve the whole experience and enjoyment for the community who utilise the facility on a regular basis.
	Restricted funds are in place to cover ongoing running costs of the Church. These costs include the wages of the Minister, Organist, heating, electricity, insurance, Chapel and Vestry upkeep and the

	maintenance of the graveyard and administration costs.
