2. DECISION RECORD - 19TH SEPTEMBER 2019

RESOLVED that the decision record of the meeting of the Executive Board Member for Environment held on the 19th September, 2019 be signed as a correct record.

3. STOPPING UP OF REDUNDANT PUBLIC HIGHWAY LEADING TO THE FORMER GALLT-Y-BERE BRIDGE, RHANDIRMWYN.

The Executive Board Member considered a report which detailed a proposal formally stop up a disused route whereby the construction of the new Gallt-Y-Bere Bridge had rendered the old bridge crossing route and associated highway links unnecessary.

It was reported that the adjoining landowners were aware of the proposal and that each landowner abutting the areas to be stopped up would be further consulted as part of the statutory legal process.

The Executive Board Member noted the area to be stopped up as highlighted in red within Appendix A appended to the report.

RESOLVED to approve the stopping up order as detailed within the report and instruct the Head of Administration and Law to process the stopping up of the area of public highway under Section 116, Highways Act, 1980.

Proposed vertical measures - Pentrepoeth Road

1. BRIEF SUMMARY OF PURPOSE OF REPORT.

The scheme is part of the second year of works outlined in our Welsh Government funded Safe Routes in Communities bid for Llanelli West. This is a community led project with the issue of speeding along Pentrepoeth Road being raised by residents and local members.

There have been extensive discussions with residents directly affected, with two letter drops requesting feedback on potential locations for the vertical measures along the road and surrounding area. Suggested alterations have been incorporated before the final design was submitted to the formal consultation process.

As a reflection of this there have been no objections from those residents living on Pentrepoeth Road itself.

Two objections have been received from residents nearby with the issues being summarised below:

- Mechanical issues to vehicles caused by speed bumps;
- · Potential issues for emergency service vehicles;
- Excessive number of humps in and around Llanelli:

2. OTHER OPTIONS AVAILABLE AND THEIR PROS AND CONS

Following the recent objections and subsequent discussions within the project team two options are presented for consideration. The advantages and disadvantages of the proposals have been outlined below:

Option 1- Proceed with the introduction of vertical measures on Pentrepoeth Road, Llanelli

Option 1 is to proceed with the vertical measures as set out in the attached plan.

Advantages of this option include:

- Fulfilling the works outlined in our Welsh Government approved SRiC bid;
- Lowering traffic speeds as requested by residents and local members;
- Improving crossing facilities to allow better permeability of the walking network



Disadvantages of the introduction of the vertical measures are that it is contrary to the wishes of two local nearby residents.

Option 2 – Do not proceed with the introduction of vertical measures along Pentrepoeth Road, Llanelli

Option 2 is to not proceed with the introduction of vertical measures. Advantages include:

- Heeding the wishes of two local residents;
- No alteration or disruption to existing routes.

Disadvantages of option 2 are being forced to give money back to Welsh Government as the scheme will no longer be able to proceed. Additionally, it will not alleviate the concerns of speeding raised by local residents and local members.

It is requested that **Option 1** is considered for approval.

Each specific objection has been considered below and a response to each is set out in the appendices of this report.

1	Mechanical issues caused to cars and other motorised vehicles	Advice directly taken from DfT's Local Transport Note 1/07 on Traffic Calming states 'Vehicles travelling over road humps at appropriate speeds should not suffer damage, provided the humps conform to the Highways (Road Hump) Regulations'. Please note that the proposed humps will conform with Highways Regulations.
2	Excessive number of speed humps in Llanelli.	Vertical measures are introduced in areas with high vehicle speeds. Physical measures, such as speed humps are the most effective means of lowering speeds. Humps were requested by residents of Pentrepoeth Road and with the support of Local Members. Any introduction of vertical measures requires formal consultation with objections being considered by the Executive Board Member.
3	Speed humps cause issues to emergency services and discomfort to patients	Emergency services are consulted directly as part of the process. They are asked to comment or object. We didn't receive any comment from the services as part of this specific scheme.
