Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or .
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK -

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national . of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card Issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) Issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay . Indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document . giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.

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- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Biometric immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card Issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current immigration Status Document containing a photograph Issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, **iess than 6 months old**, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2) of the immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity -- such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - self-employed e.g. contracts, involces, or audited accounts with a bank,
 studying e.g. letter from the school, college as university and address.
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. 

e) Relevant Sections of the Local Licensing Policy.

The Licensing Authority believes that the following sections of Carmarthenshire's Licensing Policy are relevant to this licence application:-Section 3 Fundamental principles, Section 4 Conditions of Licence, Sections 5 – 9 relating to The Licensing Objectives and Section 11 relating to Licensing Hours.

f) Proposed Operating Schedule.

Having considered the current application and the operating schedule put forward by the applicant, the Licensing Authority believes that, if the application were granted, the wording set out in the operating schedule, is not sufficiently precise to enable it to form clear enforceable licence conditions in accordance with section 18(2)(a) of the Licensing Act.

The Police and Environmental Health have both submitted letters of representation in relation to the application. The Police representation requests that 13 additional conditions be attached to the licence should the application be granted. The Environmental Health representation also outlines licence conditions which they believe are appropriate to attach to the licence if the application is granted. In addition they have outlined the need for further detailed information from the applicant prior to the granting of a licence to provide regulated entertainment consisting of recorded music.

Further representation have been received from other persons, which set out their concerns and objection to the application. The subcommittee will have to be satisfied that granting the application will not undermine the licensing objectives.

If the application is granted, I believe that given the nature of the premises and its proximity to neighbouring domestic properties it would be appropriate to replace all the statements made in the operating schedule with conditions numbered 1-13, requested by the Police and conditions 1-2 requested by Environmental Health. Further given the representation submitted by Environmental Health it would be appropriate to consider limiting the licence granted to the sale of alcohol only unless a Noise Impact Assessment and Noise Mitigation Plan has been provided which satisfies the concerns of the Environmental Health Officer.

These representations have been prepared on the 5th of September 2019 with the benefit of viewing the original application and representations from Police, Environmental Health and other persons.

I would be grateful if the applicant could contact me to discuss the above representations at the earliest opportunity and certainly prior to the application being referred to a Licensing Sub Committee hearing for determination.

Further to the receipt of the above application, I would like to make the following representations on behalf of the Environmental Health Section of Carmarthenshire County Council.

The above premises has not previously been a Licensed Premises, therefore we do not have a history of "Public Nuisance" or "Public Safety" complaints relating to the Premises Licence. Nevertheless I would like to make the following comments that are based on my professional opinion, experience from dealing with similar venues across the county and also the following factors relating to this application

- The nature of the activities applied for.
- The nature of the locality and its close proximity to existing residential properties
- A noise complaint received on June 2018 when amplified music was being played at the premises.
- The proposed operating schedule does not contain sufficient noise control measures.

There whilst considering the above points I recommend that to ensure that the "Public Safety" Licensing objective is being promoted we suggest that the following conditions are attached to the Premise Licence.

- 1. No glass vessels to be removed from the premises.
- 2. The terminal hour for the consumption of alcohol within external areas shall be 22:00.

Whilst I acknowledge that subsequent to the initial noise complaint received in June 2018, a number of Temporary Event have been held at the premises without the Local Authority being notified of a noise problem. However I do also note that for the majority of these temporary events the applicant did not apply for "Regulated Entertainment" to be held at the premises. Therefore whilst considering this, the premises proximity to a large amount of residential properties and also the noise complaint received in June 2018 I recommend the following. Should the applicant wish to apply for Regulated Entertainment in the form of Recorded Music, then to ensure that the "Prevention of a Public Nuisance" Licensing objective is being promoted, we request the applicant to undertake and submit a written Noise impact Assessment (NIA) and a Noise Mitigation Plan (NMP) for the premises.

Once a NiA and NMP has been received then the information should assist me in deciding whether or not to object to the application and/or whether to recommend any suitable conditions to promote the "Prevention of Public Nuisance" Licensing Objective.

Alternatively the applicant may wish to amend the current application by removing the Recorded Music elements from the application. This would negate the requirement of undertaking a Noise Impact Assessment for the above Premises Licence Application. Should the applicant decide on this option then I would advise the applicant to obtain appropriate advice on the "Live Music Act 2012" and its deregulation for Live and Recorded Music at Licensed Premises.

Should you agree with the above and wish to accept the conditions, you are required to confirm in writing that you do so. A copy of your acceptance should be forwarded to the Licensing Section and myself.

COMMENT ON LICENSING APPLICATION: LLANELLI WANDERERS RFC

1. We are writing with regard to the application by Llanelli Wanderers RFC for a premises licence, as published in the register of applications. This representation should be read as an objection to the application and is made following careful consideration of the likely impact on our family and other local residents should the licence be granted.

2. To help inform our consideration, we have engaged with our local councillor and also benefitted from attending a public meeting hosted by the applicants. It was helpful to listen to representatives of the club set out their current intention for the events and activities where a licence to play recorded music and serve alcohol would benefit their plans. A key reason for the application is given as avoiding the administrative burden and cost of applying for individual events licences when needed, to a maximum of 15 per annum.

3. In 2015, the club gained planning permission to construct an upper floor extension above the existing changing rooms. My copy of the full planning application (Ref: S/39314) shows that permission was sought to adapt the building to include an area for committee meetings along with a 'multi-purpose room'. The application stated that the facility would have limited usage confined to Saturday afternoons, Sunday mornings and occasional mid-week games during the rugby season.

4. It appears that to grant an alcohol licence in line with the terms applied for would represent a change of use which deviates significantly from the assurances given to help secure the planning permission granted four years ago. We would respectfully ask that the stated use of the facility at that time be borne in mind when considering the current licensing application.

5. We note in particular the request for opening hours from 12.00 to 00.00, Wednesdays to Sundays. This is clearly at odds with the statement made in support of the original planning application and it is perhaps right to consider whether residents consulted as part of the planning process could ever have envisaged the current proposal.

6. The clubhouse is situated opposite and very close to our home which is set within a densely populated and normally tranquil residential area. The clubhouse is also in close proximity to a large new housing development on the former site of the Stradey rugby ground. We would be more than happy to invite licensing committee members to our home to see first-hand the setting described.

7. The nearby tennis and cricket clubs already provide venues for the enjoyment of alcohol and music, with the cricket club in fact being described by Wanderers representatives as their headquarters. We believe that the establishment of a further venue for the regular serving of alcohol is therefore unnecessary and introduces needless risk of creating a public nuisance.

8. Since the redeveloped clubhouse was opened, residents have experienced loud music into the evenings on a number of occasions. We have complained directly to the relevant department of the County Council because, in our case, the nulsance caused was made even more acute by the fact that the first floor of the clubhouse is level with our bedrooms.

9. We have engaged positively with the club to help resolve this and to try to prevent a repeat occurrence. Representatives have been understanding and apologetic, but have been unable to guarantee our continued peace by ruling out the use of the facility for club events.

10. Those leaving the rugby club (or alighting from coaches following away games) can be loud and inconsiderate and our children are often disturbed by the noise. We are concerned that if the licence is granted this public nuisance will become a more frequent occurrence, disrupting the peace of local residents late into the evening both on weekends and on weekdays.

11. A particular concern to be considered is the fact that a number of houses are situated directly on the boundary of the car park of the club, with their front doors and windows facing the main entrance/exit of the clubhouse itself. Any disturbance and noise nuisance late at night will surely be felt keenly by those residents too.

12. Events hosted by the club create an inevitable increase in the numbers of cars and taxls visiting the site. It is worth noting that the club is only accessible to vehicles by crossing the cycle path. Currently, local residents, passing cyclists, children and walkers encounter traffic only when rugby matches, training sessions or events are taking place. But if the club is open during the hours requested in the application, it will increase the risk to public safety and place a strain on the limited parking facilities at the site.

13. Without doubt, the fact that the club has been confined to hosting a limited number of events in line with the terms of the individual licences has contributed greatly to our peace of mind. The fact that these occasions have been limited in number and controlled in their nature has helped reduce our sincere and significant concerns over the erosion of our peace and the enjoyment of our privacy and quality of life.

14. Having received helpful responses to our enquiries with council officials, we understand that the Intention set out in section 5 of the licence application (OPERATING SCHEDULE) is more of a statement of intent to assist the licensing committee's decision. But should the licence be granted, we understand the club will not be bound to keep to its stated intent unless specified in the licence. In this case, while the intention now is to make limited use of the licence - primarily on weekends during the rugby season - there will effectively be nothing to prevent the club from playing music and serving alcohol between noon and midnight, five days per week, every week. To permit a licence with such wide scope would seem excessive, given the intention set out by the applicant.

15. For the reasons set out above, we respectfully submit that the temporary licensing arrangements currently in place are the most appropriate measure and that a permanent licence to play music and supply alcohol should not be granted.



16. In the event that the decision is made to grant the licence, we would respectfully request that it be restricted in order to minimise the public nuisance and safety risks caused to local residents.

17. In light of the concerns detailed above, we would ask that committee includes in any licence a condition that the club only supplies alcohol on Fridays and Saturdays between 13:00 and 23:00 and with a closing time no later than 23:30. This will at least limit eliminate noise nuisance during weeknights and prevent the disruption to children's sleep before school.

18. Where the club wishes to host events outside of those times, we would suggest the committee considers asking that the events be limited in number, accurately and specifically described by the applicant and set out clearly on any licence that may be granted.

19. Finally, we would like to highlight our disappointment that the inclusive and consultative approach taken by the club when it submitted its 2015 planning application has not been replicated in this process. While the original development was proactively communicated via the local press and through a consultation with residents, we heard by chance about this licensing application with little over a week left to make our views known.

20. Given the lack of any meaningful notice to the community and the time of year chosen to make the licensing application, it may be that many more residents would have offered their views, but have not been made aware or have had insufficient time to do so.

21. in conclusion, we would extend our sincere thanks to the committee for its consideration of this important matter and the observations we have offered. We stand ready to offer any further information, documentary evidence or other clarification that might assist.

One has concerns, as when the club have previously sold alcohol under Temporary Event Notices, they have been disturbed by music noise and the noise from intoxicated people leaving the club.

The other is concerned at being disturbed by noise from people leaving the club late at night, having drunk alcohol.



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
