Mandatory conditions.

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol.

- a. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - i. at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - ii. at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- b. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory condition where the premises licence includes a Condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity:

- a. Each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- b. But nothing in (1) above requires such a condition to be imposed
 - i. in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - ii. in respect of premises in relation to
 - any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- c. For the purposes of this section
 - i. "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
 - ii. paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.



Mandatory condition where licence authorises the exhibition of films

- a. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, it is a condition that the admission of children to the exhibition of any film is to be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the British Board of Film Classification.
- b. Where the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.
- c. In this section
 - i. "children" means persons aged under 18; and
 - ii. "film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c. 39) (authority to determine sultability of video works for classification).

Mandatory Licensing Conditions Sections 19A and 73A of the Licensing Act 2003

- (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any Irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nulsance, or harm to children
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a



table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

4. —

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that -

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures —

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.





Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

- a) General all four licensing objectives (b, c, d, e)
- 1. A Personal Licence Holder will be present on the premises during peak trading periods.
- 2. Incorporate a "zero tolerance" policy to ensure that all offenders are automatically ejected fro the premises and prevented from re-entry in the future.
 - b) The prevention of crime and disorder
- 1. Management and staff (including Door Staff) will police all interior and exterior areas to the best of their abilities as customers enter/leave the premises and use the beer garden.
- 2. The Management will "ban" any troublesome customers from the premises and report any antisocial/criminal behaviour of persons to the Police.
- 3. A Personal Licence Holder to be on the premises at peak trading times, namely at weekends, all Bank Holidays and on days when seasonal variations take place.
- 4. A CCTV system to be installed at the premises, to be of a standard that is acceptable to the Carmarthenshire Division of Dyfed Powys Police.
- 5. Applicant to provide details of system installed, name of installer and date when system commissioned.
- 6. To cover all areas where licensable activities take place also all entrances and exits.
- 7. This system shall be recording whenever the premises are open for licensable activities.
- 8. All recordings to be kept for a minimum of 31 days.
- 9. The availability of a competent person at all reasonable times, who is capable of providing immediately a copy of any CCTV footage, upon the request of any investigation agency.
- 10. No glass vessels to be removed from the premises. Plastic/Polycarbonate glasses or bottles only to be used within any outside area/beer garden.
- 11. The DPS to become a member of the local pub watch scheme if and when set up also to support the BOBB scheme, 'Behave or be banned'.
- 12. All inclusive nights or other irresponsible drinks promotions not to be permitted.
- 13. The applicant to support the Police in any Initiatives to prevent crime and disorder such as the use of Passive Drugs Dog, Itemizer Drug Scanning Machine or any other relevant resource or tool.

c) Public Safety

- 1. Management and staff (including Door Staff) will police all interior and exterior areas to the best of their abilities as customers enter/leave the premises and use the beer garden.
- 2. The premises will have a Health and Safety Policy and will conduct regular risk assessments prior, during and after opening to identify and remove any potential issues.
- 3. A "one in, one out" policy will be adopted at times where capacity is achieved.
- 4. All indoor sports (pool, darts, skittles etc) to cease every night at 23:00.
- 5. No re-admittance to premises after 23:00.
- 6. No smoking signs will be displayed on the premises.
- 7. Maximum occupancy 100 as agreed with Fire Officer.
- 8. Door Supervisors to be employed at the premises at all times when regulated entertainment takes place.
- 9. When employed Door Supervisors must be registered with the SIA, to be in duty until the time that all members of the public have left
- 10. the premises and in any case where the capacity exceeds or is expected to exceed 100 persons.
- 11. The Licence holder shall supply an appropriate number of Door Supervisors for the maximum occupancy figure stated in the licence and the appropriate number shall be 2 in respect of the firs 100 persons and one for each additional 100 persons or part of 100 persons comprised in the maximum occupancy figure.
- 12. No Door Supervisors shall be permitted to consume intoxicating liquor or other intoxicants during any period of duty at the premises. A Door Supervisor shall report on duty in a sober condition.
- 13. The Designated Premises Supervisor or Premises Licence Holder shall nominate for each and every door a Door Supervisor who's duty it shall be to ensure that the exit door is opened immediately in the event of a fire or other emergency and if practicable no more that one door shall be designated to each Door Supervisor.
- 14. No Door Supervisors shall be engaged in any duty that would otherwise prevent him:-
 - (a) carrying out his duty as a Door Supervisor or
 - (b) Exercising general supervision and control of persons attending the premises.
- 15. The Licence Holder shall ensure that there is in force an appropriate Public liability insurance Policy relating to his/her use of the premises for licensable activities. A copy of which shall be on display at the principal point of entry and shall be produced to a Police Officer or an Officer of the Licensing Authority upon request.
 - d) The prevention of public nuisance
- 1. Notices asking customers to respect neighbours and to leave quickly and



quietly will be displayed at all exits.

2. All windows and doors will be closed (health & Safety permitting) during performances of live music, DJ, Karaoke, dance etc.

3. During performances of live music, dance, DJ, Karaoke etc, noise levels will be strictly monitored and controlled to be no greater than reasonable accepted levels.

4. Management will periodically and randomly check the exterior of the premises during performances of live music, dance and DJ, to assess noise levels and take immediate action to minimise if applicable.

5. No persons to be allowed to leave the premises to smoke on the pavement

or roadway outside the premises.

6. That there is a terminal hour of 22:30 in any outside location within the boundaries of the premises, for the consumption of alcohol. After this time only those persons who wish to smoke be allowed within this area.

e) The protection of children from harm

1. Management, bar staff and door control staff will ask for credible ID for any persons looking under age of 18 years old before admittance/being served.

2. Management, bar staff and door control will periodically and randomly check the premises to ensure that there are no underage customers consuming alcohol on the premises. If so, customers will be ejected from the premises.

3. The 'Challenge 21 Policy' to be adopted by the applicant.

4. No person under the age of 18 shall be employed on the premises whether paid or unpaid for the purpose of serving alcohol.

5. No children under the age of 16 years to remain on the premises after 22:00 unless they are attending a pre-booked event or function.

6. No children's disco's to take place on the premises.

Annex 2 Cont.

Embedded Conditions

On licence

The licence restrictions that relate to the sale of alcohol do not prohibit:

(a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel:

(b) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;

(c), consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply



of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;

- (d) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the dispatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (e) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (f) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;

(g) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or

(h) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or

(i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of Ilquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

Access for children (Premises without children's certificate)

Children In bars

No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

(1) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.

(2) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.

(3) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises, which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.

(4) The bar is in rallway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of

the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any piace exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

Credit Sales

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied unless it is paid for before at the time when it is sold or supplied:

(a) With and for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time, consumed with the meal and paid for together with the meal;

(b) For consumption by a person residing in the premises or his guest and paid for together with his accommodation;

(c) To a canteen or mess.



Further to the receipt of the above application, the Licensing Authority make the following representations:

a) Previous Enforcement Action / Prosecutions

Since 2005, when the premises licence was first held by the applicant, a number of warning letters have been issued in relation to failures to comply with the requirements of section 57 of the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to licence documents being held and displayed at the premises. A further warning letter was issued in 2012 following a visit to the premises which revealed regulated entertainment being provided without a door supervisor or personal licence holder being present as stipulated in the licence conditions. In March 2016 a further warning letter was issued in relation to providing regulated entertainment without a door supervisor being present in accordance with the licence conditions.

b) Complaints.

There have been no complaints received by the licensing authority in relation to these premises.

c) Responsible Authority Referrals.

The licensing authority has received a referral from the Dyfed Powys Police In May 2016, regarding difficulties and delays in obtaining CCTV footage following incidents.







d) Relevant Sections of the Statutory Guldance.



The Licensing Authority believes that the following sections of the Statutory Guidance are relevant to this licence application: - Section 1 Introduction, Section 2 relating to The Licensing Objectives, Section 5 relating to Premises licences, Section 8 relating to Applications for Premises Licences and Section 10 relating to Licence Conditions.

e) Relevant Sections of the Local Licensing Policy.

The Licensing Authority believes that the following sections of Carmarthenshire's Licensing Policy are relevant to this licence application:
Section 3 Fundamental principles, Section 4 Conditions of Licence, Sections 5
– 9 relating to The Licensing Objectives and Section 11 relating to Licensing Hours.

f) Proposed Operating Schedule.

The operating schedule attached to the variation application indicates that the applicant proposes to operate the premises in accordance with the existing licence conditions.

Having considered the current licence conditions and the operating schedule put forward by the applicant, the Licensing Authority believes that, if the application were granted, the wording set out in the operating schedule, which refers to the existing licence conditions, is not sufficiently precise to enable it to form clear enforceable licence conditions in accordance with section 18(2)(a) of the Licensing Act.

In view of the permitted hours sought by the applicant, the previous warning letters and the intention to extend trading into the more challenging hours of the night time economy in the centre of Ammanford, the licensing authority believes that it is appropriate to request that the applicant provide a written assessment in accordance with paragraphs 5.2 – 5.5 of the councils licensing policy prior to determining the application. (Copy attached)

The licensing authority requests that the applicant clarifies the proposed management of the premises under the extended hours with specific reference to existing licence conditions a)1, b)3,b)10, c)5 and d)6, to ensure that the final conditions are clear and enforceable.

The applicant is also requested to confirm whether it is intended for the designated premises supervisor to be at the premises during the extended hours.

I am aware that the Dyfed Powys Police have made representations indicating that they believe it would be appropriate to attach additional conditions to the licence if the variation application is granted. The applicant may wish to refer to these conditions when outlining control measures as part of the above assessment.

The licensing authority believes that subject to receiving the above assessment it would be appropriate to attach conditions 1-18 requested by the Dyfed Powys Police to the premises licence if the variation is granted.

I would be grateful if the applicant could contact me to discuss the above representations at the earliest opportunity and certainly prior to the application being referred to a Licensing Sub Committee hearing for determination.

The Police will object to the hours applied for on Sundays 09.00 to 03.00hrs and ask that the applicant amend the hours to end at midnight.

In April and May 2016 Police Officers when dealing with alleged incidents at the premises have had difficulty in immediately obtaining the CCTV footage.

Also there is currently no camera installed to cover the front door, the main entrance to the premises. The Police will ask that the CCTV system currently installed be upgraded in line with the latest Home Office Specification as listed in Points 1 to 13 within the below representations.

The premises are located close to the town centre of Ammanford and the hours applied for within the Variation application will significantly change the character of the premises.

The Carmarthenshire Division of the Dyfed Powys Police will make the following representations.

- 1. The whole of the licensed area with entry and exit areas must be covered by CCTV cameras, and there must not be any hidden or obscured areas. This will deal with issues which may arise outside the premises when customers have been arriving or leaving. The beer garden and car park must also be covered by CCTV camera's
- 2. The System must be installed by a company certified by SSAIB or NSI Gold standard.



- 3. Main entrance and rear exit to the beer garden to have a camera meeting a minimum of 100%R image quality.
- 4. All footage must be of good quality and of a minimum performance capability sufficient to identify Individuals.
- 5. It must be in colour.
- 6. It must record at a minimum of 12 images per second.
- 7. All images will be time and date stamped.
- 8. All footage during the hours of Licensable activities to be retained for a period of 30 days.
- 9. The CCTV system must operate continuously, and if a defect arises the police and local authority must be informed and immediately in writing, arrangements must be made to rectify the fault
- 10. All footage must on demand_be made available to a Police Officer, Police Community Support Officer and Local authority Officer for viewing and a copy of that footage made immediately available to the above officers.
- 11. At all times during the period of operation of the premises there must be a competent person on the premises capable of reply and be able to undertake the export of recordings quickly onto a removable storage medium. Memory Stick, CD, or DVD format is acceptable to the police. The master copy will be available to the police on demand.
- 12. The system must incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be played back on any Microsoft Windows or MAC compatible computer. The application software required to launch and view recorded images must either be included as part of the standard operating system installed or be installed to the recorded media when the data is copied to that media.
- 13 The system must be registered with the Information Commissioner (Tel 0303 123 1113 or email registration@ico.org.uk)

Please refer to the Dyfed Powys Police CCTV requirement document for full specification. This can be accessed by contacting Pc. Rob Chapman at the Community Safety Office Ammanford Police Station telephone number 01269 590580 as a matter of urgency to discuss the above CCTV conditions prior to any agreement being reached. To ensure that any system installed complies with the requirements of the proposed licence conditions.

14. The consumption of alcohol by customers at the premises must cease at or before the end of opening hours as specified in the premises licence. Staff are required to



collect all alcoholic drinks prior to the end of the opening hours as set out in the licence.

- 15. The applicant to implement a wind down procedure to include the following:
 - a. Last Orders to be announced at 02.40
 - b. Reduction in music levels/change in style of music at 02.40
 - c. Lighting levels to be raised at 02.40
 - d. With the lighting levels to be further raised at 03.00
 - e. Bar staff to move from the bar area at the terminal sale of alcohol at 03.00
 - f. All bar staff to begin to collect empty glasses in the customer area at 03.00
 - g. Door supervisors in appropriate high viz coats along with the DPS to encourage customers to disperse from the door/curtilage of the premises to adjacent Taxis.
- 16. Door Supervisors to be on duty whenever regulated entertainment is provided after 23.00hrs and also when Licensable Activities take place after 01.00hrs.
- 17. The applicant to also risk asses the use of door supervisors at all other times for Regulated Entertainment, if provided before 11pm. especially on Bank Holiday weekends, Christmas Eve, Boxing Day and New Year's Eve and major televised sporting events.
- 18. Whenever Licensable Activities take place after 01.00hrs. a personal Licence holder must be on duty.

The above conditions the police believe are necessary and appropriate to promote the Licensing Objectives.

Further to the receipt of the above application I would like to make the following representations on behalf of the Environmental Health Team of Carmarthenshire County Council. The Environmental Health Team of Carmarthenshire County Council have concerns over the variation application in its current format due to the following reasons-:

- 1. The premises over the last five years has generated a number of noise complaints, whilst operating under the current Premises Licence Holders. The noise complaints received were concerning to loud music both inside and outside the premises.
- 2. The property is a detached property with an unsecured beer garden that has direct access into a public car park.
- 3. The variation application is seeking to extend the opening hours of the premises until 3:30 am on Friday to Sunday. Also it is seeking to allow the premises to play Recorded Music, both indoors and outdoors up until 3:00am on Friday to Sunday.
- 4. The applicant has not submitted a risk assessment (as per paragraph 5.1 to 5.5 of Carmarthenshire County Council Licensing policy) to assess the potential impacts the variation application may have on the Prevention of a Public Nuisance and Public Safety Licensing Objectives. Subsequently the application doesn't contain any additional conditions or an operating schedule setting out in detail the control measures the applicant intends to put in place to deal with the risks identified in the assessment.

- the inclusion of recorded entertainment both indoors and outdoors,
- the previous complaints received regarding the premises
- location of the premises.

The Risk Assessment would ideally set out in detail the control measures they intend to put in place in order to ensure that the Public Safety and the Prevention of Public Nuisance" Licensing objectives are being promoted.

I would be grateful if the applicant could contact me to discuss the above representations at the earliest opportunity and certainly prior to the application being referred to a Licensing Sub Committee hearing for determination.
