Both pieces of work are well developed but not finalised. It is considered the Committee will be in a more informed position to comment on the Action Plan and the Quality Assurance Framework once both documents have been finalised.	New Committee Cycle
<b>Welsh Language in Social Care Services for Older People</b>	Rhian Dawson, Head of Integrated Services	Following the report considered by the Committee in November 2016, it had been anticipated that the results of the data collection exercise on staff Welsh language skills could now be reported on. The aim was to provide a profile of the social care workforce skills and needs; however analysis of the data has revealed inaccuracies and inconsistencies.	New Committee Cycle
