The Licensing action group, a bi monthly meeting between the Police and Council licensing department, continues to tackle any problem locations and licensed premises where there are concerns relating to alcohol and substance related crime and disorder. Incidents at such premises continue to be closely monitored to agree a joint plan of action to be delivered in partnership.
