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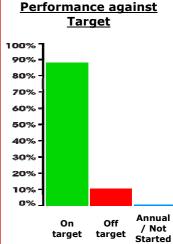

The event network circle was updated in this period to contain further up to date information on how event organisers can access help and central funding especially the tourism based grants now available for 2018. We have assisted Welsh Government to set up a regional working group to horizon scan possible events for them to support in year 2020 onwards in January 2018.

The Champions are authority employees volunteering for this role in addition to their current duties throughout the organisation who provide support and advice. The Coordinator has been working 3 days a week for the past 12 months with a focus on achievable programs and employee health and wellbeing interventions. To date a number of health and wellbeing events have been held across the Authority ranging from employee lung function tests to a Health and Wellbeing Fair which consisted of a variety of stalls all focussed on informing and improving the health and wellbeing of the workforce.
