STOPPING UP OF PUBLIC HIGHWAY AT GLANRHYDSAESON FARM, MANORDEILO, LLANDEILO

A request has been received from a landowner via Network Rail, to stop up a length of public highway as a consequence of closing an unsignalized level crossing under a NR national programme to reduce the number of crossing points along live railway lines. The link section of highway has been unmaintained for many years by CC and serves no strategic benefit to the authority. I have consulted with Cllr. Davies and Stuart Quick who both support the proposal. The costs for the stopping up order will be charged to Network Rail by way of an advance payment of £2500 with agreement to refund or recharge based on actual costs.

The adjoining landowner supports the proposal and I can further advise that the landowner abutting the highway to be stopped up will be further consulted as part of the statutory legal process. Objections received at this stage will be investigated with an intention to secure a retraction of the objection/s prior to the Court hearing.

The area of public highway would be stopped up by way of Order at Magistrates Court under Section 116 of the Highways Act 1980. In this instance, upon approval of the Order the land will revert to the adjoining landowner for Land Registry registration.

It is therefore requested that the Head of Administration and Law to proceed with the Order to present at Magistrates Court at their earliest convenience.

2. Legal

An application to stop up a highway has to follow a defined process and under the Highways Act 1980 can only be made on two grounds, namely the length of highway is unnecessary or that there is a more commodious route. There is an initial consultation process to be undertaken by the Environment Department which includes (inter alia) corresponding with the Community Council seeking its views on the proposal.

Should Cabinet Member consent be forthcoming there is then a requirement to make an application to the Magistrates Court to seek an Order pursuant to section 116 of the Highways Act 1980 to stop-up the highway. It will be necessary for an officer from the Authority to present evidence at the hearing advising why the application is appropriate and that the granting of the Order is necessary.

3. Finance

The stopping up will carry a financial implication met by CCC to administer the order but will benefit from the removal of future maintenance and public liabilities. Network Rail are covering the full cost of the road closure.
