MEETING WITH POLITICAL GROUP LEADERS

The Local Government and Elections (Wales) Act 2021 places a statutory duty upon the leaders of political groups in County and County Borough Councils to take reasonable steps to promote and maintain high standards of conduct by the members of their political group, and to co-operate with the council's standards committee in the exercise of the standards committee's functions.

Carmarthenshire County Council has three political group leaders, namely.

Councillor Darren Price (Plaid Cymru)
Councillor Deryk Cundy (Labour)
Councillor Jane Tremlett (Independent Group)

The Act also places a duty on the Standards Committee to monitor compliance by leaders of political groups on the council with their duties under the Act, and to publish an annual report which must include the committee's assessment of the extent to which leaders of political groups on the council have complied with their duties under the 2021 Act.

Statutory guidance issued by the Welsh Government expands upon these duties and provides that Group Leaders should meet with the whole Standards Committee at the start of each year to discuss.

- (1) the frequency of meetings between the Committee and Group Leaders during the year.
- (2) the compliance by the Group Leaders with their duties under the 2021 Act,
- (3) the annual reporting process and
- (4) any issues arising from the analysis of complaints in respect of standards of behaviour

As part of this process each Group Leader has been asked to provide an annual report to the committee which will then form a basis for these discussions. Copies of the annual reports received are attached to this report along with the assessment criteria previously shared with group leaders.
