Comment	Dinefwr Childcare Team (DCCT) and West Childcare Team (WCCT)are now operating the systemic model of delivering social work services. This means that the team works in 3 pods, each with a leader (Assistant Team Manager /Senior Practitioner), 2-3 social workers, a Family Support Worker and a Unit Coordinator. A member of the Education Psychology Service (EPS) acts as clinician to the teams in their weekly pod meetings. There was some delay in the process to recruit a Family Support Worker for each systemic pod in these teams. There has been a review of admin. staff that resulted in revised job profiles that clarify the role of the Unit Coordinators. Unit Coordinators are being recruited to fill the vacant posts in the childcare teams. In the next 2 months Carmarthen Childcare Team (CCCT) will implement the approach and then East Childcare Team (ECCT). Pod leaders attend developmental sessions facilitated by tutors from the Family Institute every 2 months to ensure pod leaders develop the necessary knowledge, skills and confidence in the approach. The psychologist from EPS is exploring ways of ensuring there is sufficient psychology capacity to meet the needs of the 4 childcare teams.
