BRECON BEACONS NATIONAL PARK AUTHORITY

On 11 April 2017 the Welsh Government commenced a consultation on proposals for the reduction in the membership of the Brecon Beacons National Park Authority (BBNPA). The proposal within the consultation was to reduce the membership from 24 to 18 members to be achieved by reducing the number of Local Authority members from 16 to 12 and the number of Welsh Minister appointees from 8 to 6.

The Council, formally objected to reducing Carmarthenshire's membership to 1 member as it was disproportionate to the proportion of Carmarthenshire land located within the park, and proposed that Carmarthenshire's representation should be unchanged.

The Council has now been advised by the Deputy Minister for Local Government and Housing that the reduction in Carmarthenshire County Council representation on the National Park Authority (from the current 2 members to 1 member) will take effect from 1st April 2020.

Schedule 7 of the <u>Environment Act 1995</u> states that the Council should "have regard" to the desirability of appointing members onto the NPA who represent different electoral divisions situated either wholly or partly within the Park and the largest percentage of land is currently within electoral wards held by the Plaid Cymru Group.

The Council is currently represented on the park by Councillors Andrew James (80% of ward within park area) and Kevin Madge (50% of ward within park area), as such it is recommended that the Council's representation on the BBNPA be revised in accordance with the decision of Welsh Government and that Cllr Andrew James be appointed as the Council's sole representative on the BBNPA.
