Project Description/ Community Benefit	Splat Cymru is the first social enterprise to operate within the educational and community sector originated from a small reading business called Splat Education.  Its aim was to provide and support pupils through art and technology aimed at the education sector, however, it became apparent that there was a need for this in the community.  Inspiration came from being a part of the Raise project which looked at raising self esteem of children within deprived areas.
	This was an extremely positive and beneficial project which enlightened and enriched children's outlook on what they could achieve.
	The ongoing aim is to provide communities with the skills and confidence needed to lead engaging projects which will raise their self confidence, enlighten their aspirations and take ownership, and with all of this combined creating solid, sustainable foundations for the next generation.
	This project aim is to continue from the growing pilot schemes and provide an art camp to be run during holiday times, supporting Pupils Learning through Art and Technology, getting the children out of the house first and foremost, engaging children in the great outdoors and giving them a sense of ownership of objects in public spaces and play areas but also getting them talking about what they are doing by being involved in creating things and taking ownership of them.
	Splat Cymru will be focusing its energy towards the Amman Valley area using Art and Technology based strands, offering a wide range of accessible activities to schools and communities, with the Glanaman, Garnant as the main ward; however its reach will extend its project towards Ammanford, Betws Pontamman, Penygroes, Saron, Tycroes and Llandybie.
