### Prohibition of driving, BOAT 57/74, St.IIItyd's walk, Burry Port/Penymynydd

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1.1 This report is to determine objections received to proposed prohibition of driving order.

### 2. Background

The Council proposes to introduce a prohibition of driving order, to improve safety along the Byway open to all traffic (BOAT) 57/74. The BOAT runs from its junction with Heol Ddu U 2323 at Penymynydd for a distance of 1.7 Kilometres in a South Westerly direction. The BOAT is considered unsafe for motorised vehicles.

### 3. Consultation

Statutory consultees have been consulted, with no objections being received. The proposal has been formally published.

The published order gave indication that exemptions would be allowed for pedestrians, horses, cyclists, motorbikes and residents living along the BOAT.

The Council received five objections including a petition.

# Objection to proposed disabled persons parking bays - lane to rear of Heol Morlais, Hendy.

It is proposed to introduce two disabled parking bays (adjoining each other) on the lane to the rear of Heol Morlais, Hendy.

Designated disabled parking bays, capable of being enforced by the Council's Civil Enforcement Officers, have been requested at this location by the local Member of the County Council.

The disabled persons parking bays will facilitate improved access for local residents with impaired mobility.

The Council has consulted the various Statutory Consultees about the proposals (the Police, the Local Member, Welsh Ambulance Service, Fire Brigade, Road Haulage Association, and Freight Transport) with no objections received.

The Council has formally published the proposals in the local press, resulting in one objection being received as follows: -

A local resident objects to the proposal stating that only one disabled bay is required as parking is a major issue in the street, and the loss of two parking spaces will result in people having to park in adjoining streets. The resident has no objections to only one disabled bay being provided.

A visit to the site by a Council Traffic Officer indicated that there is capacity for eleven passenger car vehicles (approx.) to be parked in the off-carriageway parking area accessed via the lane to the rear of Heol Morlais. This is in addition to the unregulated parking of passenger car vehicles on the carriageway [of the lane to the rear of Heol Morlais] (with capacity for approx. nine passenger car vehicles).

It is recommended that the Executive Board Member for Technical Services: -

- 1. Determine the objection.
- 2. Implement the restrictions as published,
- 3. Inform the objector accordingly.



Objections to the Proposed County of Carmarthenshire (Llanelli) (Waiting Restriction and Street Parking Places) Consolidation Order

- 1. Purpose
- 1.1 This report is to determine objections received to proposed prohibition of waiting at any time restrictions.
- 2. Background
- 2.1 The Council proposes to make an order varying the County of Carmarthenshire (Llanelli) (Waiting Restriction and Street Parking Places) Order so as to include various new restrictions.
- 3. Consultation
- 3.1 The advertised proposals are listed in **Appendix 1** and indicated on plan in **Appendix 2**.
- 4. Objections and comments:
- 4.1 Seven representations have been received to the proposals and the following is a breakdown:

Carrick Avenue, Llanelli - (Prohibition of Waiting at Any Time)

- 4.2 The objections and comments are summarised in **Appendix 3** along with officer comments.
- 4.3 Carrick Avenue, Llanelli

The County Council received two objections to the proposed restrictions on Carrick Avenue. The objections were on the grounds of loss of on-street parking amenity, challenging the extent of the restrictions and potential devaluation of properties.



On the 9<sup>th</sup> October 2015 a site meeting on Carrick Avenue attended by a Council Traffic Officer, a local Member of the County Council, a Roads Policing Officer and local residents was held to explain the proposed on-street parking restrictions. At the site meeting the Roads Policing Officer confirmed his support for the restrictions as published. The local Members have not objected to the proposals.

It is recommended that the prohibition of waiting restrictions are implemented as published.

### 4.4 Stanley Road, Llanelli

The County Council received one objection to the proposed restrictions on Stanley Road. The objection was on the grounds of loss of available on-street parking opposite residential properties and the purpose of the restrictions.

The proposed restrictions on Stanley Road at the junction with New Dock Road were sought by the local elected Member of the County Council in the interests of protecting visibility at the junction.

The proposed restrictions on Stanley Road in the vicinity of the entrance to a heavy goods vehicle yard were requested by the local elected Member of the County Council in the interests of facilitating access to / from the yard entrance before the 8am and after 6pm.

It is recommended that the prohibition of waiting restrictions are implemented as published.

### 4.5 Penyrheol Drive, Llanelli

A site meeting was held on the 8<sup>th</sup> Oct. '15 with a Council Traffic Officer and a local resident. The Officer received a request to reduce the length of the restrictions on the western side to 10m. The request was submitted to the local elected Members of the County Council.

The local Members of the County Council support the requested amendment. It is recommended that the prohibition of waiting restrictions are implemented as published, with the exception of the restrictions on the western side of Penyrheol Drive which should extend for a distance of 10m from the junction with Felinfoel Road.

### 4.6 Gelli Deg / Capel Road, Llanelli

The County Council received two objections to the proposed restrictions on Capel Road. The objections were on the grounds of loss of available on-street parking.

The restrictions were introduced over 18 months ago using an experimental order. The experimental order has expired. The County Council's Traffic section intends to make a permanent traffic order so that the double yellow lines maybe enforced.

The Council does not intend to extend the existing double yellow lines at the junction of Gelli Deg / Capel Road.

A site meeting was held on the 5<sup>th</sup> Nov. '15 between a Council Traffic Officer and a local business owner (who raised an objection) to explain the proposed order.

The local Members of the County Council have not raised an objection to the proposed restrictions.





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The request to reduce the proposed length of the double yellow lines at the junction will be referred to the Council's Road Safety Engineer for assessment. The Engineers assessment will be reported at the Executive Board Member decision meeting. Any proposal to reduce the length of the junction parking restrictions must be balanced with the need to protect visibility at the junction.

It is recommended that the prohibition of waiting restrictions are implemented as published.

### 4.7 Nevill Street, Llanelli

The County Council received one objection to the proposed restrictions on Nevill Street. The objection was on the grounds of loss of available on-street parking.

The proposed restrictions were sought by the local elected Member of the County Council following reports that a municipal refuse wagon had difficulty gaining access from Nevill Street to the rear lane because of inconsiderate parking.

It is recommended that the prohibition of waiting restrictions are implemented as published.

No declarations of personal interest were made at the meeting.

## 2. LLANELLI SHOPMOBILITY.

The Executive Board Member was informed that the County Council has supported the Llanelli Shopmobility scheme since 2011 with a three year funding arrangement supported by a Service Level Agreement (SLA). The current funding arrangement was due to expire this year.

The Llanelli scheme provided a valuable service for the disabled and was successful with 232 members to date. The group generated income from charges and fundraising. The scheme was, however, mainly reliant on the County Council's financial support and the Group had requested further financial support from the Council for the current year, amounting to £6,500.

Shopmobility was one of the many initiatives being encouraged by the Authority to support the town and was one of the key priorities within the Authority's Integrated Parking Strategy i.e. "To provide more facilities for the mobility impaired – including appropriate levels of parking provision within car parks and through the encouragement of Shopmobility schemes within town centres".

The Council had no revenue allocation to fund further support this year, however, it would receive a contribution of £32,313 from the Bus Services Support Grant to fund community transport development and such schemes included Shopmobility.

RESOLVED that Llanelli Shopmobility be supported with a further grant of £6,500 from the Bus Service Support Grant for the current financial year and an updated Service Level Agreement be prepared.

## 3. CARMARTHEN SHOPMOBILITY.

The Executive Board Member was informed that the County Council has supported the Carmarthen Shopmobility scheme since 2011 with a three year funding arrangement supported by a Service Level Agreement. The current funding arrangement was due to expire this year.

The Carmarthen scheme provided a valuable service for the disabled and was



successful with 1,021 members to date. The Group generated income from charges and fund raising. The scheme was, however, mainly reliant on the County Council's financial support and the Group had requested further financial support from the County Council for the forthcoming 12 months, based on the level of support provided for the final year of the SLA i.e. £13,596.

Shopmobility was one of the many initiatives being encouraged by the Authority to support the town and was one of the key priorities with the Authority's Integrated Parking Strategy i.e. "To provide more facilities for the mobility impaired – including appropriate levels of parking provision within car parks and through the encouragement of Shopmobility schemes within town centres".

The Council had no revenue allocation to fund a further 12 months support. It would, however, receive a contribution of £32,313 from the Bus Services Support Grant to fund community transport development and such schemes included Shopmobility.

RESOLVED that Carmarthen Shopmobility be supported with a further grant of £13,596 for a further 12 month period, commencing September 2015.
