1. DECLARATIONS OF PERSONAL INTEREST

There were no declarations of personal interest.

2. DECISIONS RECORD - 5TH AUGUST 2020

RESOLVED that the decision record of the meeting held on the 5th August 2020 be signed as a correct record.

3. TARGETED REGENERATION INVESTMENT TOWN CENTRE RECOVERY FUND

The Executive Board Member considered a report on the Welsh Governments lifting some of its Covid-19 restrictions for non-essential retail and leisure and hospitality businesses, whereby a number of town centre businesses across the county were facing the challenges of reopening and operating businesses within the limitations of the revised government guidelines. In order to support those primary town centre businesses across Carmarthenshire the Welsh Government, following lobbying, had approved a regional request from the South West Wales Targeted Regeneration Investment (TRI) Group, via the lead body partner (Swansea), to allow for the top slicing of TRI allocations to support town centre recovery. As part of that request, Carmarthenshire had been advised that £75k of its allocation could be top sliced to support each of the three primary town centres within the County (Ammanford, Carmarthen and Llanelli) to receive a notional allocation of £25k per town.

The Executive Board Member thereupon considered the schemes parameters/guidelines and processes and how it would operate. If adopted, the preferred delivery routes to achieve the best value for money, whilst ensuring local ownership/buy in/local management, timely delivery and provided each of the towns with a co-ordinated intervention would be:

Carmarthen – A Joint Application developed between Carmarthen Town Council and Carmarthen Bid:

Llanelli - A Joint Application between Llanelli Town Council and Llanelli Bid

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Carmarthenshire County Council

Ammanford – Direct delivery application developed by Carmarthenshire County Council in conjunction with

Ammanford Town Council and task force to be submitted by either Carmarthenshire County Council or a combination of Carmarthenshire County Council and Ammanford Town Council.

It was reported that due to the urgency of delivery, post approval at Economic Panel Stage, consideration would need to be given to whether to allow applicants to proceed with project delivery whilst formal political approvals were sought

RESOLVED THAT

- 3.1 the Welsh Government's offer to top slice £75k of TRI funding allocation to deliver a Recovery Fund in Primary Town Centres be accepted;
- 3.2 the proposed processes and pro-formas to be used for the delivery of the fund be agreed;
- 3.3 the preferred routes for delivery be agreed;
- 3.4 participants be allowed to proceed, at their risk, with project delivery whilst formal approvals were sought;
- 3.5 In the event of applications being required to be submitted directly by Carmarthenshire County Council agreeing to fund required capital allocation in line with the required intervention rate, funding be made available from the Transformation Strategic Project Fund.

4. TARGETED REGENERATION INITIATIVE TOWN CENTRE RECOVERY GRANTS

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY EXECUTIVE BOARD MEMBER DECISIONS MEETING FOR THE LEADER 30th September 2020

ARFOR

Background

The aim of the ARFOR programme is to ensure economic growth and prosperity, by enabling people to obtain employment opportunities within local communities which will contribute towards securing the prosperity of the Welsh language in rural communities.

Led by Gwynedd County Council, the programme will be delivered in Carmarthenshire, Gwynedd, Ceredigion and Anglesey with the 4 Local Authorities working in collaboration due to their social and cultural similarity.

ARFOR is seeking to promote entrepreneurship, business growth and community resilience with a focus on promoting the use of the Welsh language by providing an opportunity for new and existing businesses.

ARFOR is a third-party grant scheme, which can include both capital and revenue funding. Funding allocation for Carmarthenshire is 456,250.

To date there have been 17 successful applications, resulting in a total investment of in excess of 800k to rural Carmarthenshire including private sector investment.

Proposed Eligibility Criteria

Due to the need to commit funding by end of the financial year and relatively small amount of budget remaining we propose the following changes:

- Due to the level of grant remainin, the maximum grant be reduced to £5,000 with each grant award based on up to 60% of the total eligible costs
- Due to current economic climate, applications must as a minimum demonstrate existing jobs being safeguarded and/or new jobs being created as a result of ARFOR assistance
- Applications will need demonstrate ways in which it will support the sustainability of the Welsh language within their proposed project as well as wider community.



Application Process

The Arfor fund will be administered as follows:

- Interested applicants will request and application form and submit applications in line
 with the guidance which will be considered by a project panel made up from
 representatives from the Local Action Group Grŵp Cefn Gwlad, who also administer
 LEADER funding for rural Carmarthenshire. This approach will ensure a more coordinated and joined up approach in the delivery of both programmes.
- Applications meeting the required scoring criteria and benchmarks will proceed for full approval via Executive Board meeting.
- The decision making panel and Council's Executive Board Member will then assess and consider each application following assessment panels scoring.

Meanwhile Spaces

Aligned with the recommendations of the Rural Taskforce Moving Rural Carmarthenshire forward report as well as initial findings from Economic growth plan development within rural market towns, the need for rural business space has been identified to foster business growth and entrepreneurialism.

9k of ARFOR budget has been idenitifed for the piloting of business hubs across rural Carmarthenshire. Funds idenitifed will be used for costs such as rental costs, purchase of suitable equipment and fit out costs for the re-development of under utilised spaces within rural market towns.

Llwyddo'n Lleol

Allocate 10k of ARFOR budget to target young people to venture into business within rural Carmarthenshire.

The proposed eligibility criteria will be as follows;

- Applicants aged between 18-30
- New business to be located within rural Carmarthenshire
- All sectors will be eligible bar agriculture due to fund restrictions
- Successful applicants will receive a financial support up to a maximum of £1000
- Mentoring support will also be made available to successful applicants

Recommendations:

- 1. To approve the revised application & prioritisation process as set out above
- 2. Approve the utilisation of 9k of ARFOR budget to pilot the use of un—used spaces within rural market towns for business hub/pop up shop activities
- 3. Approve the utilisation of 10k ARFOR budget for Llwyddo'n Lleol bursary programme as set out above
