Project Description	Clybiau Plant Cymru is a charitable organisation that exists to help communities within Wales by promoting, developing and supporting quality, affordable out of school childcare clubs.

	The charity has developed a pilot project to complement the findings of the Childcare Sufficiency Assessment Report (2014-2017), which was produced by CCC. The report identified that there is an unmet demand for registered out of school childcare across various areas of the county, particularly the Amman network area. The report also suggests that the cost of childcare provision tends to be high within this area, with the household income being low.
