PUBLIC SPACE PROTECTION ORDER RENEWAL – INITIAL STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

Purpose:

Approval to survey/engage with relevant stakeholders to gather information in preparation for the renewal of our Public Space Protection Order (PSPO).

Recommendations / key decisions required:

To endorse a snap survey to relevant stakeholders namely Town and Community Councils and Sports Associations to establish what additional conditions they may like to add onto the existing PSPO that currently covers the 3 conditions relating to dog controls.

Reasons:

The Government have made provision to introduce Public Space Protection Orders and in July 2019 the authority adopted 3 conditions relating to dog orders which were:

1. Allowing a dog to foul without pick it up anywhere within Carmarthenshire where the public have access on payment or otherwise.
2. Dogs must be placed on a lead following direction by an authorised officer.
3. No dogs allowed in enclosed children’s play areas.

The orders are reviewed every 3 years and as part of that process an engagement exercise is required to capture from the relevant stakeholders any additional conditions to the existing 3 above.

It is important to stress that following the Home Office guidance any requests by the stakeholders for additional conditions must be evidenced and if proven would be subject to formal public consultation as part of the order making process.

It should be noted that a formal engagement process associated with the PSPO will be undertaken when the draft orders are made. The purpose of this particular engagement is to inform the process and establish a view on any additional orders required over the baseline order for the three conditions set out above.

**PUBLIC SPACE PROTECTION ORDER RENEWAL –
INITIAL STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT**

Public Space Protection Orders were introduced to replace the Dog Fouling of Lands Act which was the primary legislation used by Enforcement Officers to control dog fouling in the county. The legislation was restricted only to designated land and fell short of the expectations placed on Enforcement Officers to fulfil their role.

With the introduction of Public Space Protection Orders, Officers were now able to deal with dog fouling offences across Carmarthenshire anywhere the public had access on payment or otherwise. It also enabled officers to deal with dogs off leads and excluding dogs from enclosed play areas.

Any offences committed could be dealt with by either the issuing of a fixed penalty ticket or process via summons to the Magistrates Court. Recently, the authority undertook an asset transfer exercise where recreational land was transferred to Town and Community Councils or Sports Associations.

Early engagement with those stakeholders via a snap survey would be an ideal opportunity to establish what additional conditions may be necessary to fulfil any issues they may have.

The information received will then be used to formulate reports to the Corporate Management Team and Preliminary Cabinet prior to formal consultation as part of the process of making the order. Following that process the orders will then be formulated and reviewed in another 3 years.
