- Publicity materials notifying customers of the operation of the Challenge 25 schemes shall be displayed at the premises, including a Challenge 25 sign of at least A5 size at point of sale.

There have been no previous prosecutions or enforcement action taken by the licensing authority in relation to these premises. The premises have previously held two premises licences. One premises licence was a converted Justices licence issued in 2005. The second premises licence was granted in 2010 and both were surrendered by the licence holder in 2017.

b) Complaints.

There have been no complaints received by the licensing authority in relation to these premises.

c) Responsible Authority Referrals.

The licensing authority has not received any referrals from the other responsible authorities in relation to the above premises.

d) Relevant Sections of the Statutory Guidance.

The Licensing Authority believes that the following sections of the Statutory Guidance are relevant to this licence application: - Section 1 Introduction, Section 2 relating to The Licensing Objectives, Section 5 relating to Premises





licences, Section 8 relating to Applications for Premises Licences and Section 10 relating to Licence Conditions.

e) Relevant Sections of the Local Licensing Policy.

The Licensing Authority believes that the following sections of Carmarthenshire's Licensing Policy are relevant to this licence application:-Section 3 Fundamental principles, Section 4 Conditions of Licence, Sections 5 – 9 relating to The Licensing Objectives and Section 11 relating to Licensing Hours.

f) Proposed Operating Schedule.

Having considered the current application and the operating schedule put forward by the applicant, the Licensing Authority believes that, if the application were granted, the wording set out in the operating schedule, which refers to the existing licence conditions, is not sufficiently precise to enable it to form clear enforceable licence conditions in accordance with section 18(2)(a) of the Licensing Act.

The Police and Public Health have both submitted letters of representation in relation to the application. The Police representation requests that additional conditions be attached to the licence should the application be granted. The Public Health representation also outlines licence conditions which they believe are appropriate to attach to the licence if the application is granted.

A further letter of representation from another party has raised a number of points in relation to planning permissions for the premises. The sub committee will be aware that it may only consider matters which relate to the licensing objectives. As set out in paragraph 13.5 of the Councils Licensing Policy <a href="https://www.carmarthenshire.gov.wales/media/1224858/licensing-policy.pdf">https://www.carmarthenshire.gov.wales/media/1224858/licensing-policy.pdf</a> there should be clear separation between the planning and licensing functions.

Given the location of the premises and the activities and hours requested within the application, if the application is granted, I believe it would be appropriate to replace all the statements made in the operating schedule with conditions, requested by the Police and Public Health in their letters of representation.

These representations have been prepared on the 27<sup>th</sup> of August with the benefit of viewing the original application and representations from the Police, Public Health and another party.

I would be grateful if the applicant could contact me to discuss the above representations at the earliest opportunity and certainly prior to the application being referred to a Licensing Sub Committee hearing for determination.

#### Dear Committee

I would like to send my concerns around the above application, for full transparency I sit on the Licencing committee but am putting this in as I have been approached by Constituents in Queen Victoria road so I am acting as their County Councillor.

- 1) Many of the immediate neighbours feel they were not consulted in line with regulations.
- 2) As this premises and restaurant is going to be on a much larger scale than what was there previously and it should be the subject of a planning application (i) because of the increased parking requirements (there is a car park at the back of the two houses but its size was tailored to a guest house, not a 20 bedroom hotel and 60 seat restaurant) (ii) because of the increased business at the premises, particularly at night and involving a bar as well as a large restaurant open to the public and including service outdoors, in a residential street, surrounded by family homes. As I am sure you agree Residents should have the opportunity to make representations on the scale of the development and its effects on their amenity.
- 3) I have been looking though the records as there seems to have never any planning application or consent for a restaurant open to the public at 86/88A Queen Victoria Road in 2010.
- 4) At the time residences were told by planning at the time that the restaurant was only for the use of guests this over time turned out to not be true, demonstrated by the amount of trade going through the premises.
- 5) The absence of requirement for a planning application for the restaurant in 2010 and the increased scale of business now proposed means that a planning application should be considered and licensing procedures should be delayed until that is sorted.

Taking in to consideration the above concerns I ask that the application is reviewed to see if correct plaining is in places for the change of use before we consider the Licensing application.
