e) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

- The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that a written notice of authority is kept at the premises for all staff who sell alcohol. The notice shall be made available for inspection upon request of the police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority and all staff selling alcohol must be in possession of formal identification to verify their identity against the notice.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- 24 manned reception with telephone
- A minimum of 1 x Night receptionists working 11pm until 7am
- Any person evicted from the premises for acts of violence or criminality shall be reported immediately to Police. The manager shall record details of such incidents in the premises log book/diary/electronic recording system and this record shall be produced upon request to any authorised officer.

c) Public safety

- 24hr manned building
Minimum of 1 people on site at all times
- Staff training on the effects of alcohol and how to spot early signs of customers becoming drunk should be provided to give them the knowledge and confidence to deal with drunken patrons.
- Staff should be aware of their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003 and be able to recognise appropriate 'cut off' points for serving drunken customers, so as to reduce the likelihood of fights or aggressive behaviour.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- Minimum of 1 people on site at all times
- The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons drinking and/or smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.

e) The protection of children from harm

- No adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children, (for example, but not exclusively, nudity or semi nudity), regardless of whether children are present on the premises, are permitted within the premises at any time when the premises is open to the public.
- A Challenge 25 policy shall be operated at the premises at all times. All staff shall check identification of all persons who appear to be less than 25 years old. This check shall be made by examining either a passport, photographic driving licence or a PASS approved proof of age card. No other form of identification shall be accepted.
- Publicity materials notifying customers of the operation of the Challenge 25 schemes shall be displayed at the premises, including a Challenge 25 sign of at least A5 size at point of sale.

I would like to send my concerns around the above application, for full transparency I sit on the Licencing committee but am putting this in as I have been approached by Constituents in Queen Victoria road so I am acting as their County Councillor.

- 1) Many of the immediate neighbours feel they were not consulted in line with regulations.
- 2) As this premises and restaurant is going to be on a much larger scale than what was there previously and it should be the subject of a planning application (i) because of the increased parking requirements (there is a car park at the back of the two houses but its size was tailored to a guest house, not a 20 bedroom hotel and 60 seat restaurant) (ii) because of the increased business at the premises, particularly at night and involving a bar as well as a large restaurant open to the public and including service outdoors, in a residential street, surrounded by family homes. As I am sure you agree Residents should have the opportunity to make representations on the scale of the development and its effects on their amenity.
- 3) I have been looking though the records as there seems to have never any planning application or consent for a restaurant open to the public at 86/88A Queen Victoria Road in 2010.
- 4) At the time residences were told by planning at the time that the restaurant was only for the use of guests this over time turned out to not be true, demonstrated by the amount of trade going through the premises.
- 5) The absence of requirement for a planning application for the restaurant in 2010 and the increased scale of business now proposed means that a planning application should be considered and licensing procedures should be delayed until that is sorted.

Taking in to consideration the above concerns I ask that the application is reviewed to see if correct plaining is in places for the change of use before we consider the Licensing application.
