## 2. APPLICATION TO TRANSFER A PREMISES LICENCE AND VARY THE DESIGNATED PREMISES SUPERVISOR. STAMPS, 69 STEPNEY STREET, LLANELLI SA15 1AA

The Legal Services Manager briefed all present on the procedure for the meeting.

The Sub Committee was advised that an application had been received from Aaron Lee Coelho to transfer a premises licence and vary the designated premises supervisor at 'Stamps', 69 Stepney Street, Llanelli.

The Sub Committee noted that the following documentation was attached to the report:

- Appendix A Copy of the application;
- Appendix B Representations submitted by the Dyfed Powys Police.



The Sub Committee also noted a further representation by Dyfed Powys Police dated 18<sup>th</sup> April 2022 which had been circulated to all parties and published on the Council's website since the despatch of the agenda.

The Sub Committee received oral representation from Sgt. Ben Ashton on behalf of Dyfed Powys Police who referred to his written representations. Sgt Ashton confirmed that the police objected to the application as submitted on the grounds referred to in the written representations.

All parties present were afforded the opportunity of questioning the Police Authority representative on his submission.

The Sub Committee received oral representations from Mr. E. Smith, the leaseholder of the premises, and Mr. A.L. Coelho, the applicant in support of the application and in response to the police representation.

All parties present were afforded the opportunity of questioning Messrs. Smith and Coelho regarding the representations made.

The Sub-Committee thereupon

UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED to retire into private session in order to receive legal advice pursuant to Paragraph 16 of Schedule 12 to the Local Government Act.

Having regard to the relevant paragraphs of the Licensing Authority's Statement of Licensing Policy and the guidance issued by the DCMS and the Home Office, it was:

FURTHER UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED that, having considered all the evidence before it, the Sub Committee finds that the application should be refused.

#### -REASONS

In coming to its decision, the Sub-Committee made the following findings;

- 1. Mr Coelho has a criminal conviction in 2015 for affray.
- 2. Jordan Parry has a number of criminal convictions, including convictions for drug related offences and offences of violence. Some of these convictions relate to organised crime.
- 3. Mr Coelho's sister was involved in the same drugs related crimes as Mr Parry.
- 4. The premises opened on the 31<sup>st</sup> March and since then there have been several incidents of crime and disorder at the premises.
- 5. The premises is located in an area identified in the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy as a Crime and Disorder hotspot.
- 6. Jordan Dale Parry is a friend of Mr Ethan Smith the leaseholder.

The Sub Committee attached weight to the views expressed by the police.



The Sub Committee noted that concerns and fears about what might happen if an application was granted were not relevant considerations unless supported by real evidence. The Sub Committee considered that the recent incidents at the premises and the criminal convictions outlined did amount to real evidence which supported the concerns that the police had about the applicant and his associates.

The Sub Committee paid particular regard to Chapter 4 (Paragraphs 4.69 to 4.71) and Chapter 8 (Paragraphs 8.99 to 8.102) of the statutory guidance and noted that a refusal of the application should only occur where there were exceptional circumstances which suggested that the crime prevention objective would be undermined.

The Sub Committee noted that the police rarely objected to such applications and that the convictions outlined in the police evidence were both serious and numerous. There were clear connections between the applicant and those linked with organised crime. This, combined with the recent incidents at the premises suggests to the Sub Committee that exceptional circumstances did exist in this case.

Therefore the Sub Committee was satisfied that it was appropriate to refuse these applications in order to promote the crime prevention objective set out in the Licensing Act 2003 and that this was a proportionate response to the issues identified.

The Sub Committee was afforded the opportunity of examining both the internal and external facilities of the property. Following conclusion of the site visit, the Sub Committee reconvened in the Council Chamber at County Hall, Carmarthen and remotely at 11.15a.m. to consider the application.

The Legal Services Manager briefed all present on the procedure for the meeting which had been convened to consider a subsequently amended application received from William James for the grant of a premises licence in respect of the Gwernllwyn Care Home, Llandeilo Road, Cross Hands, Llanelli, as follows:-

The Sub Committee noted that the following documentation was attached to the report:-

Appendix A – copy of the original application;

Appendix B – representations submitted by the Licensing Authority;



Appendix C - representations submitted by Dyfed Powys Police; Appendix D – representations submitted by other persons.

The Licensing Authority representative referred to his representations, as detailed within Appendix B to the report.

He referred to the representations and suggested licence conditions submitted by the Dyfed Powys Police (appendix C) and advised those conditions had been accepted and agreed by the applicant as per the signed documentation attached to the report. That acceptance had also resulted in the applicant amending the hours sought for the sale of alcohol to Monday to Sunday 11.00 - 21:00 as referred to earlier.

All parties were afforded the opportunity of questioning the Licensing Authority representative on the representations made.

Representations were received from three objectors re-iterating the points raised in their written representations within Appendix D to the report including for example, increased traffic, impact on privacy; noise and sleep disturbance. All parties were afforded the opportunity of questioning the objectors on their representations.

The applicant responded to the issues raised.

All parties were afforded the opportunity of questioning the applicant on the representations made.

UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED to retire into private session in order to receive legal advice pursuant to Paragraph 16 of Schedule 12A of the Local Government Act.

Having had regard to relevant paragraphs of the Licensing Authority's Statement of Licensing policy and of Guidance issued by the DCMS and Home Office, it was:-

FURTHER UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED that, having considered all the evidence placed before the Sub Committee, the application for a premises licence for Gwernllwyn Care Home be granted, as amended, subject to the licence conditions agreed between the applicant and the responsible authorities and the amendment of condition 1 to read:

"The sale of alcohol from Monday to Saturday shall be limited to the residents of the care home or their guests". [Therefore this restriction will not apply on Sundays.]

#### **REASONS**

In coming to its decision, the Sub-Committee made the following findings;

- 1. The premises forms part of a registered care home;
- 2. The premises is located close to a residential area;



- 3. The premises was previously licensed, prior to its conversion into a care home:
- 4. Since conversion there have been no complaints about the premises;
- 5. None of the responsible authorities object to the grant of a licence;
- 6. The applicant has amended the application and accepted licence conditions proposed by the Licensing Authority and Police;

The Sub-Committee attached weight to the views of the Responsible Authorities.

The Sub-Committee noted that concerns and fears about what might happen if a licence was granted weree not relevant considerations unless supported by real evidence.

The Sub-Committee further noted that it was solely concerned with the licensed area and licensable activities at the premises. The Sub-Committee was not concerned with other areas of the premises or non-licensable activities.

2. APPLICATION FOR THE GRANT OF A PREMISES LICENCE - BISTRO ON THE BAY, UNIT 4 PARRY THOMAS CENTRE, PENDINE, SA33 4NZ.

The Legal Services Manager briefed all present on the procedure for the meeting which had been convened to consider an application received from Mr Robert Rea for the grant of a premises licence in respect of the Bistro on the Bay, Unit 4 Parry Tomas Centre, Pendine, as follows:-

To allow:-

The supply of alcohol and live music Monday to Saturday 11:00-23:00 and Sunday 11:00-22:30.

Opening Hours - Monday to Saturday 08:00-23:30 and Sunday 08:00-22:30.



The Sub-Committee noted that the following documentation was attached to the report:

- Appendix A Copy of the application;
- Appendix B representations submitted by the Licensing Authority, together with further information submitted by the applicant, including agreement of all conditions stipulated within the Licensing Authority representations;
- Appendix C representations submitted by other persons.

In addition to the above, the following supplemental information was also circulated to all parties present at the meeting:-

• Copy of a plan detailing the sanitary convenience facilities available within the vicinity of the Bistro on the Bay, Unit 4 Parry Tomas Centre, Pendine.

It was noted that no representations had been submitted by the remaining Responsible Authorities in respect of the application.

The Licensing Authority representative referred to his representations, as detailed within Appendix B to the report and advised that there had been no previous prosecutions or enforcement action taken by the Licensing Authority and furthermore no complaints had been received in relation to the application premises.

The Licensing Authority representative referred to the suggested conditions proposed in relation to CCTV arrangements, and their acceptance by the applicant. He advised that if the Sub-Committee was minded to grant the application, it was considered appropriate for those conditions to be attached to the licence.

All parties were afforded the opportunity of questioning the Licensing Authority representative on the representations made.

The Chair advised that the objector was not in attendance at the meeting to address the Committee, however her written representation was set out at Appendix C of the report.

The Sub-Committee received oral representations from Mrs Rea, the joint leaseholder of the premises, in support of the application and in response to the Licensing Authority's representations and the issues raised by the objector, as set out at Appendix C of the report.

All parties were afforded the opportunity of questioning the applicant on the representations made.

UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED to retire into private session in order to receive legal advice pursuant to Paragraph 16 of Schedule 12A of the Local Government Act.



Having had regard to relevant paragraphs of the Licensing Authority's Statement of Licensing policy and of Guidance issued by the DCMS and Home Office, it was:-

FURTHER UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED that, having considered all the evidence placed before the Sub-Committee, the application for a premises licence in respect of the Bistro on the Bay, Unit 4 Parry Tomas Centre, Pendine be granted, subject to the licence conditions agreed between the applicant and the Licensing Authority. Furthermore, alcohol sales be permitted only during periods when customers have access to the disabled toilet at the Parry Thomas Centre and/or the other toilets at the Centre or at Y Caban.

#### **REASONS**

In coming to its decision, the Sub-Committee made the following findings of fact;

- 1. None of the Responsible Authorities object in principle to the granting of the licence.
- 2. The Licensing Authority have asked for additional conditions to be placed on the licence, which have been accepted by the applicant.
- 3. A member of the public has objected to the application on the grounds of inadequate toilet provision.
- 4. The applicant has provided further information regarding access to toilet facilities at or near the premises.
- 5. No evidence has been presented of problems arising during the operation of the previous licence or recent TENS in connection with the level of toilet access for customers.

The Sub-Committee attached weight to the views of the Responsible Authorities and noted that concerns and fears about what might happen if a licence was granted were not relevant considerations unless supported by real evidence.

The Sub-Committee was satisfied that provided customers had access to adequate toilet facilities, the granting of the licence would not undermine the licensing objectives.

The Sub-Committee was satisfied that provided customers had access to the disabled toilet at the Parry Thomas Centre and/or the other toilets at the Centre or at Y Caban, then the provision of toilets was deemed adequate.

The Sub-Committee would be concerned however if that access was reduced or restricted in any way.

The Sub-Committee considered it appropriate and proportionate to impose an additional licence condition that alcohol sales can only take place during periods when customers have access to the disabled toilet at the Parry Thomas Centre and/or the other toilets at the centre or Y Caban.

#### PRIVATE HIRE VEHICLE LICENCE

To consider an application from Mr Geoffrey Karin Davies of Airport Flyer, 37a New Road, Dafen, Llanelli, to be granted an exemption from Condition 5a and 5b of the Council's Licence Conditions for his Private Hire Vehicles PH 546 a Kia Optima registration number CP18 UTF, Private Hire PH 567 a Ford Tourneo registration number SA72 GPF and Private Hire PH 509 a Renault Traffic registration number CU18 HXB

That should the vehicle be used for Private Hire other than Executive Hire type work listed, then the applicant shall immediately notify the Licensing Authority and the exemption shall cease in relation to such hiring.

That the vehicle displays an identification disc on the front and rear windscreens, as specified by the Licensing Authority.
