1. Background

Likeafish Swim School Ltd is a swimming school based at Pensarn, Carmarthen who provide swimming lessons and other aquatic activities.

The proposed project involves the installation of a 60kw solar panel system with a 10kw battery storage support.

It is expected that the project will reduce the businesses demand on the grid by as much as 60-70% and produce an annual output of around 48,000kWh

It is estimated that 30.57552 tonnes of carbon will be saved over the course of 3 years.

Recommendation:

To approve a grant award of £25,000 towards an eligible project cost of £56,656.42 for the installation of 60k/w solar panel system and a 10kw battery storage support, subject to:

- Legal charge placed on lease,
- Landowner consent query being resolved.

In the interim the applicant has confirmed that they have £20,000 available in their bank account as well as a credit limit of up to 30,000 available on their business credit card.

The applicant has gone with the 2^{nd} cheapest quote due to the cheapest not being able to meet the minimum specification of the brief. The brief stated that being able to produce 60kWh from their solar panel was a requirement and the cheapest only managing to give a price for 56.8kWh

7.0 Project Officer's comments

- Applicant is looking to install a 60kWh system along with a 10kWh battery storage system which is expected to reduce bills by 60-70% whilst saving over 10 tonnes of carbon equivalent per year
- The applicant has chosen to go with the 2nd lowest price due to the cheapest not meeting the minimum specification of 60kWh; the difference in cost between the two quotes is £1362.42. A grant of £25,000 towards total eligible costs has been requested – This represents a grant of 44.126%.
- The applicant has provided confirmation of match funding via a bank statement to show they have circa 20k in the business bank account, whilst having approx. 30k available on the business credit card to get application through panel; However the applicant will replace this with a Carmarthenshire Energy loan as soon as the loan is open;
- A planning application has been submitted for a certificate of lawful development with the decision outstanding, building regulations will also need to be confirmed
- The applicant has obtained consent from the leasehold owner however permission may be required from the landowner (WG)
- Microgeneration Certification Scheme (MCS) and building regs will not cover systems over 50kWh; for systems over 50kWh there is an accreditation process called ROO-FIT has been set up by Ofgem for which the installer should be accredited to
