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Chair's Foreword



Welcome to the Annual Report for the Health and Social Services Scrutiny Committee for the Civic Year 2022/23. As Chairperson I am pleased to present this report to you detailing the work undertaken by the Committee during the year.

Following the local elections in May 2022, all apart from two Members were new to the Committee including myself. This in itself brought challenges and with this in mind it was agreed to

arrange visits to different centres so that we as Members got a better understanding of what each department is responsible for. This is an ongoing programme until we have covered each section of Social Care & Children's Services.

We were again, during this year, subject to the Authorities (coronavirus) (meetings) Wales Amendment) Regulations 2020 which came into force on the 22nd April 2020. Whilst the re-elected Members were familiar with remote working this has been an additional learning for new Members. With all of this and the excellent training programme immediately after the May elections our first Scrutiny did not happen until October 2022. Remote working makes it a better option for some Councillors who are able to join remotely who might not otherwise be able to be a part of Scrutiny. All options are good but for getting to know each other and officers, I think it would be helpful to meet in person at least once during the year.

The Communities Department continue to work well on many aspects and also jointly on many services with the Hywel Dda Health Board which is hugely beneficial to service users. I believe that this is the way forward as there are so much integration of areas that will benefit from joint working. Carmarthenshire is leading the field in this and hopefully others will follow suit. There have been challenges since Covid with a shortage of Domiciliary Care workers, this is being address with a vigorous recruitment campaign which hopefully will assist in these vital services being fully staffed without having to rely on agency staff. Llesiant Delta Well-being is also working hard to support people with the Delta Connect programme and their response services. Children's Services are also continuing to respond to the current placement capacity crisis, coupled with the increase in the demand for mental health service provision needs for young people post-pandemic.

We as a Scrutiny Committee have committed to undertake a Task and Finish project to look at Active Start for 0-11 year olds which will be reported in the next Annual Report. I am looking forward to a full programme for the coming year and to gain a greater knowledge of the services and skills coming under this vital portfolio.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank my fellow Members for their participation, to all the officers and staff for their care and ambition for a well looked after population in this County. I would also like to thank Emma our Democratic services support officer for her knowledge and guidance which has been invaluable in this our first year.

1. Introduction

The scrutiny function is a key element of the County Council's governance arrangements and decision-making process. Although not a decision-making body, Scrutiny is at its most effective when it grasps the potential to influence and inform decisions made by both the Council and partner bodies affecting the County.

Article 6.2 of the Council's Constitution requires all Scrutiny Committees to "prepare an annual report giving an account of the Committees activities over the previous vear."

The main aim of the report is to highlight the work that has been undertaken by the Health & Social Services Scrutiny Committee during 2022/23. It aims to provide Members with an opportunity to reflect on the achievements during the year and to identify what worked well and where improvements could be made. This analysis is instrumental in developing scrutiny. In addition, this report may aid to facilitate discussions on items which could be identified for inclusion within future work plans.

The Committee is chaired by Councillor Hazel Evans and is made up of 14 Elected Members. Support is provided by the Democratic Services Unit and other Council officers as and when required.

2. Overview of the work of the Committee in 2022/23

2.1 Number of Meetings

The Scrutiny Committee held 4 meetings plus a joint meeting regarding Substance Use with the Place, Sustainability and Climate Change Scrutiny Committee during the 2022/23 municipal year. Two meeting were cancelled during the year.

2.2 The Forward Work Plans

Scrutiny plays a key role in promoting accountability in the decision-making process of the Local Authority. It is also useful in ensuring that Council policies reflect current priorities, as well as promoting efficiency and encouraging partnership working with external agencies.

In order for Scrutiny Committees to take on greater ownership of their own Forward Work Plans, a pre-decision method of scrutiny was introduced in September 2022 which allows Scrutiny Committees to decide which reports from the Cabinet Forward Work Plan they wish to come before them. As per normal process Committees are also able to identify their own topics and Cabinet are still able to invite a Scrutiny Committee to scrutinise a decision which was in the pipeline.

The concept and development of the Forward Work Plan and the process for its agreement has allowed each Scrutiny Committee to determine its own

agendas. The benefits of such an approach has led to an improved level of debate and input during Scrutiny Committee meetings.

The Committee also consulted with officers to identify items to be considered by the Committee for the forthcoming year. Additional reports were also requested by members at meetings throughout the year and the Forward Work Plan was amended accordingly. In the main, meeting agendas were consistent with those outlined in the Forward Work Plan.

Following the May 2023 elections, the Scrutiny Committee remits were updated by Council and each Scrutiny Committee became responsible for the overview and scrutiny of specific Cabinet Portfolios and their respective services.

The Health & Social Services Scrutiny Committee is responsible for the scrutiny of Cabinet's Health and Social Services portfolio and the respective service areas as detailed below:

To compliment the work undertaken during formal meetings, the Committee also undertakes other scrutiny functions such as Task and Finish, visits to establishments falling within its remit together with member development sessions.

The Committee held a total of 3 Forward Planning meetings.

2.3 Performance Monitoring / Strategic Issues

Performance Monitoring Reports - One of the principal roles of Scrutiny Committees is to monitor the performance of services and functions within its remit. They undertake this work mainly through the consideration of performance monitoring reports and various action plan monitoring reports. The performance monitoring reports provide a balanced picture of performance across the relevant service areas. The Health & Social Services Scrutiny Committee received the Performance Monitoring Report for the Council's Wellbeing Objectives at the meeting in January and March 2023. The reports mainly focussed on underperforming indicators.

Draft Divisional Delivery Plans 2023-24 for: Integrated Services, Commissioning and Business Support & Adult Social Care Services - As part of its performance monitoring role the Committee received relevant information from the Council's key strategies and plans. In March 2023 the Committee considered the Draft Divisional Delivery Plans. These plans set the strategic actions and measures that the services within the Division would take forward in order for the Council to make progress against its Well-being Objectives, thematic priorities and service priorities.

It was noted that action and measures for the delivery of the Cabinet Vision Statement Commitments were also included.

Outcomes

- A letter be sent to the Health Board expressing concerns regarding the current inequality of S.117 funding arrangements.

Children's Services Draft Service Delivery Plan 2023-24 - As part of its performance monitoring role the Committee received relevant information from the Council's key strategies and plans. In March 2023 the Committee considered the Draft Service Delivery Plan which set out the strategic actions and measures that the services within the Division would take forward in order for the Council to make progress against its Well-being Objectives, thematic priorities and service priorities.

Statutory Director of Social Care Services' Annual Report 2021/22 - There is a statutory requirement for the Director of Social Services to report annually to their Council on the delivery and performance as well as plans for the improvement of the whole range of Social Services. This report was considered by the Committee in October.

Outcomes

- Recommended to Cabinet that the report be received.
- that a letter be sent to Welsh Government by the Committee Chair reiterating the importance of strengthening the structures in place with regard to Electively Home Educated children.

Communities Departmental Draft Business Plan 2020 - 2023 – In March the Committee considered the Communities Departmental Draft Business Plan 2020 - 2023 which detailed the department's aims, objectives and priorities during 2020-23. This provided the Committee with an opportunity to consider and comment upon the priorities outlined for the department for the three-year period.

Actions & Referrals - During the course of the municipal year several requests for additional items are made by members of the Committee to assist them in discharging their scrutiny role. Actions & Referrals updates are presented to Committee which provide an update on progress in relation to these requests.

2.4 Revenue & Capital Budgets

Budget Monitoring Reports - The Committee received quarterly reports on the departmental and corporate revenue and capital budgets at the meetings held in October, January and April. These reports enabled members to monitor the level of spend in each area and the progress made in connection with any capital works.

Revenue Budget Strategy Consultation 2023/24 to 2025/26 - As well as monitoring the current budget, the Committee was also consulted on the Revenue Budget Strategy 2023/24 to 2025/26. The report provided the Committee with the current proposals for the Revenue Budget Strategy for 2023/24 together with the indicative figures for the 2024/25 and 2025/26 financial years.

Revenue Budget Outturn Report 2021/22 – At its meeting in October, the Committee considered the Revenue Budget Outturn Report for 2021/22 which provided an end of year financial position.

Outcomes

The Committee resolved that a position statement be provided regarding the vacant social work posts.

The position statement was circulated in October.

2.5 Regional Adult Advocacy Strategy

The Committee considered the above-mentioned report at the Committee meeting in March the purpose of which was to seek endorsement of a new regional adult advocacy strategy that has been developed with stakeholders through the Advocacy Working Group. The Strategy aimed to shape

commissioning arrangements to meet requirements to ensure good quality advocacy is readily and equitably available to those who want, or need it, in the West Wales region of Ceredigion, Carmarthenshire and Pembrokeshire.

2.6 Youth Justice Management Plan 2022/23

The Committee considered the above-mentioned report at the Committee meeting in January 2023 which outlined the provision of the Youth Support Service and the Youth Justice Team under a single management structure which provided a holistic approach to the delivery of youth support services across Carmarthenshire. Section 8 of the Youth Justice Plan detailed the performance of the partnership during 2021/22 and also set out the priorities and improvement planning objectives for the forthcoming year in accordance with the overarching 'child first' principles and an ethos of continuous improvement.

2.7 Health & Social Services Scrutiny Committee Annual Report 2021/22

The Committee considered the above-mentioned report at the Committee meeting in October which in accordance with Article 6.2 of the Council's Constitution provided and overview of the Committee's activities over the previous year.

2.8 West Wales Care Partnership's Dementia Strategy

The Committee considered the report at the Committee meeting in October. This Strategy had been produced in partnership between officers of the 3 Local Authorities, the Health Board and third sector partners as well as people living with dementia, their carers, and family members. It supported several key objectives within the Corporate Plan, and wellbeing objective to 'support older people to age well and maintain dignity and independence in their later years'.

2.9 Domiciliary Care Strategy Update

At the request of the Committee, it considered the above update at its meeting in January 2023. The update included information surrounding the current pressure on domiciliary care and the impact that this was having on hospital discharges. The report was to provide assurance that patients were being safely supported to leave hospital and outlined the pressures and how Carmarthenshire County Council was responding to those pressures. A further update was provided at the meeting held in April 2023.

Outcomes

The Committee requested regular updates regarding domiciliary care and progress with the Health Board. It was agreed that updates would be included systematically within the performance and data monitoring reports.

An additional performance update was provided in the meeting in April.

2.10 Loneliness in Carmarthenshire Task & Finish Review Update

The Committee received for consideration at its April meeting an update report in respect of the progress made with the four recommendations emanating from the Task and Finish Review on Loneliness in Carmarthenshire undertaken during the 2018/19 municipal year.

Outcomes

The Committee requested an update report on the wider prevention work, including the progress made on the mapping exercise of all preventative services in Carmarthenshire for early 2024.

2.11 Annual Report on Adult Safeguarding & Depravation of Liberty Safeguards (DoLS)

The Committee received a report in April which detailed the role, functions and activities undertaken by the Authority in relation to Adult Safeguarding and Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards during the 2021/22 financial year.

2.12 Additional Reports & Information Requested

During the course of the year, the Committee requested reports on the following topics to be included in the Forward Work Plan:-

- Domiciliary Care Update
- Loneliness in Carmarthenshire Task & Finish Review Update
- External Review Update on the TB outbreak in Llwynhendy (pending the outcome of enquiries, consideration to be given to the submission of a letter to Welsh Government seeking financial support for the ongoing TB issue).

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors K. Davies and H. Jones.

2. DECLARATIONS OF PERSONAL INTERESTS INCLUDING ANY PARTY WHIPS ISSUED IN RELATION TO ANY AGENDA ITEM.

There were no declarations of personal interest or of any prohibited party whips.

3. PUBLIC QUESTIONS (NONE RECEIVED)

The Chair advised that no public questions had been received.



4. HEALTH AND CARE SYSTEM FOR WEST WALES: HOW FAR, HOW FAST?

The Committee considered a report detailing the opportunities in Carmarthenshire to develop and implement a health and care system for older people based on 'what matters' to this population and would be fit for purpose both now and into the future.

The Committee welcomed Rhian Matthews (Hywel Dda UHB / Carmarthenshire County Council – Integrated System Director) to the meeting. The Integrated System Director provided the Committee with details of the current state of the health and social care system and the challenges. It was noted that there was an imbalance in terms of demand and capacity relating to managing the needs of the older people population. The frail and elderly population in West Wales was growing in the region of 3% a year and would continue to grow for at least 10 years. The current position would get substantially worse without change and transformation.

It was acknowledged that hospital stays for the severely frail predisposed them to harm and poor outcomes including infection, an increased risk of falls as well as muscle loss and deterioration in previous levels of independence. This in turn increased the need for care and support on discharge increasing the demand on the finite availability of social care. Additionally, poor discharge rates compromise the Emergency Departments' ability to receive patients arriving by ambulance resulting in ambulance handover delays.

The Committee noted that there was a Section 33 Agreement between Carmarthenshire County Council and Hywel Dda University Health Board which supported an integrated management structure across community health and social care for older adults and the development of integrated care pathways (Home First) which had demonstrated in the last twelve months to have reduced care and support requirement for a targeted element of frail and elderly population by up to 85%.

The Integrated System Director clarified that the 'Home First' was an approach (not a service) taken by multi-disciplinary teams of professionals which embedded best practice for managing the frail. It consisted of rapid access to care and treatment for acute health needs within a 1-2 hour period providing a safe alternative to hospital. It also provided urgent access to primary care and reablement provision within a 8-72 hour period to support people to receive treatment and to recover from injury or illness.

It was noted that Delta Wellbeing provided a digital infrastructure and monitoring of patients being managed at home through the Delta Connect pathway.

The Committee also noted the benefits and governance arrangements as detailed in the plan.



A number of questions were raised, the main matters were as follows:

- In response to concerns expressed that some patients may request a level
 of support that may put them in danger, the Integrated Services Director
 stated that the assessment would always be based on what matters to the
 individual but that different treatments, the potential risks and alternative
 options were always considered.
- In response to a question regarding the Ty Pili Pala model, it was stated that the outcomes were better than those who stayed in community hospitals and that the Ty Pili Pala model should be rolled out to community hospitals.
- It was stated that one of the biggest challenges at the current time was changing the mindset and culture of staff from a reactive to preventative approach.
- It was acknowledged that additional work was required regarding the promotion of the Delta Connect service. It was stated that take up was better when referrals were made by health professionals.
- Concern was expressed regarding the loss of care packages when
 individuals were admitted to hospital for more than two weeks. The
 Integrated Services Director explained in some cases individuals were
 losing care packaged unnecessarily and that mitigations were being put in
 place including referrals to the Home Care First team within 36 hours. It
 was also noted that often when individuals were in hospital for a period of
 time packages of care may change due to issues such as muscle loss.
- Officers were asked if resources (staff) were available to implement the
 packages of care required. In response, the Integrated Services Director
 stated that workforce availability across the health and social care system
 was a problem for the whole of the UK but that this different approach
 would contribute to a more effective and efficient use of resources.
 Additionally, more attractive roles and reward packaged had been
 developed and several successful recruitment rounds had resulted in 20
 additional staff being employed recently.

UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED to recommend to Cabinet the approval of the proposal and high level plan.

5. DOMICILIARY CARE PERFORMANCE UPDATE

The Committee considered a report they had requested surrounding the current pressure on domiciliary care and the impact that this was having on hospital discharges. The report was to provide assurance that patients were being safely supported to leave hospital and outlined the pressures and how Carmarthenshire County Council was responding to those pressures. This report was the second update the Committee had received which included the latest available data captured on the 9th May 2023.

It was highlighted that trends were stabilising and that there was levelling off of the number of hours commissioned in relation to domiciliary care. Despite the



improvements the Committee was advised that this would be treated with caution and performance monitored closely in the coming months.

UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED that the report be received

REVENUE & CAPITAL BUDGET MONITORING REPORT 2022/23

The Committee considered the Revenue and Capital Budget Monitoring Report in relation to the Health and Social Services, which provided an update on the latest budgetary position as at 28th February, 2023 in respect of the 2022/23 financial year.

The Health and Social Services was projecting an overspend of £6,920K on the revenue budget and net variance of -£906K against the 2022/23 approved capital budget. The expectation was that at year end £1,338k of Managerial savings against a target of £1,603k were forecast to be delivered.

The main variances on capital schemes showed a forecasted variance of (£362k) against a net budget of £1,761k on social care projects, and a (£544k) variance against the Children Services projects net budget of £975k.

It was noted that the expectation was that at year end £1,338k of Managerial savings against a target of £1,603k were forecast to be delivered.

The following questions / observations were raised on the report:

- In response to a query regarding the additional costs in the Home Care
 Framework due to supporting rural provision, the Head of Integrated
 Services advised that this was due to increasing costs to incentivise
 domiciliary care service providers to work in more rural areas of the
 County.
- It was noted that the Health Board did not provide funding towards the cost of specialist support for complex needs (Looked After Services). The Head of Children and Families provided an overview of the national and local position in respect of the current placement capacity crisis, coupled with the change in the demand for mental health service provision needs for young people post-pandemic. It was highlighted that demand was continually changing and that it was a precarious position and that in previous years the provision of Welsh Government Covid grants had masked the financial position but now the Authority was having to meet the cost of demand itself.
- In response to a query regarding the provision of day services being reduced compared to pre-pandemic levels, officers advised day services was not always the best solution and that day opportunities were being offered. Day opportunities were considered to provide better outcomes for individuals and were often more cost effective. It was recognised that building based service offer was not always the better solution.

UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED that the report be received
