The public interest test in respect of this report outweighed the public interest in disclosing the information contained therein disclosure at this initial stage of a two-stage process would be a disproportionate and unwarranted intrusion into the private and family life of the Councillor in question.

The Committee considered a report received by the Council's Monitoring Officer from the Public Services Ombudsman for Wales which set out the results of the investigation into allegations that Councillor Wride had breached the members code of conduct.

Members, in accordance with the procedures adopted by the Committee, carried out an initial consideration of the report and based solely upon the contents of the Ombudsman's report came to a determination.

UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED that the report contained evidence of a breach and that Councillor Wride should be given the opportunity to make representations to the Committee, either orally or in writing, in respect of the findings of the investigation.

## 4. PRE-HEARING REVIEW IN RESPECT OF REPORT ISSUED BY THE PUBLIC SERVICES OMBUDSMAN FOR WALES REGARDING TOWN COUNCILLOR LOUISE WRIDE

Following the application of the public interest test it was RESOLVED pursuant to the Act referred to in minute no. 3 above not to publicise the content of the report as it contained exempt information relating to a particular individual and information which is likely to reveal the identity of an individual (Paragraphs 12 & 13 of Part 4 of Schedule 12A to the Act). The public interest test in respect of this report outweighed the public interest in disclosing the information contained therein as disclosure at this initial stage of a two stage process would be a disproportionate and unwarranted intrusion into the private and family life of the Councillor and other third parties referred to in the report.

The Chair welcomed to the meeting Town Councillor Louise Wride and Ms Sinead Cook of the Office of the Public Services Ombudsman for Wales.

The Chair reminded the Committee that at the meeting of the Standards Committee held on 25<sup>th</sup> August, initial consideration was given to the report issued by the Public Services Ombudsman for Wales in respect of Town Councillor Louise Wride. The Committee resolved that Councillor Wride be given the opportunity to make representations to the Committee in respect of the findings of the investigation.

The main purpose of the Pre-Hearing Review was to consider Councillor Wride's request that the final hearing be heard in private. The relevant legislation is set out in Schedule 12A of the Local Government Act and includes provision for a matter to be considered in private where it contains information relating to a particular individual (para 12) and Information which is likely to reveal the identity of an individual (para 13). Both these grounds are subject to a wider public interest test.

Ms Cooke of the Ombudsman's Office was invited to address the Committee and provided some background and context to the case.

Councillor Wride was thereupon invited to address the Committee regarding the further progress of the case.

The Deputy Monitoring Officer explained that, should the Committee decide to hold the next stage in public, the option would still be available to the Committee to enter into private session should they deem it necessary.

Following a lengthy discussion, it was

RESOLVED that, in line with the requirement for openness and transparency in relation to the duties undertaken by the Standards Committee, the final hearing of the case in respect of Town Councillor Louise Wride be held in public but with the Committee entering into private session should it be deemed in the public interest at any stage.

#### 1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE.

There were no apologies for absence.

#### 2. DECLARATIONS OF PERSONAL INTEREST.

There were no declarations of interest.

3. FINAL HEARING IN RESPECT OF REPORT ISSUED BY THE PUBLIC SERVICES OMBUDSMAN FOR WALES REGARDING TOWN COUNCILLOR LOUISE WRIDE



The Chair welcomed to the meeting Town Councillor Louise Wride and Ms Sinead Cook and Ms Sarah Jones of the Office of the Public Services Ombudsman for Wales.

The Committee was reminded that at the meeting of the Standards Committee held on 25<sup>th</sup> August, initial consideration was given to the report issued by the Public Services Ombudsman for Wales detailing the results of their investigation into allegations that Town Councillor Louise Wride had breached the Members' Code of Conduct. The Committee concluded that the report did disclose evidence to suggest that there had been a breach of the Code of Conduct. The case then proceeded to the next stage and Councillor Wride was invited to make representations regarding the further progress of the case.

At the meeting of the Standards Committee held on 14<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 a Pre-Hearing Review was undertaken, the main aim of which was to consider Councillor Wride's request that the final hearing be heard in private. The Committee resolved that today's final hearing be held in public but with the Committee entering into private session should it be deemed in the public interest at any stage.

At today's final hearing the Committee was being asked to consider the case in full and determine whether Councillor Wride's conduct breached the Code adopted by Llandovery Town Council as suggested in the Ombudsman's report.

The Committee needed to determine whether Councillor Wride's conduct brought her office as a Town Councillor and/or her Council into disrepute. The conduct in question being Councillor Wride's conviction for a criminal offence, as set out in the Ombudsman's report.

If the Committee determined that Councillor Wride's conduct breached the Code, it would then need to consider what sanction (if any) it wished to impose. The maximum sanction that could be imposed was suspension from office for up to 6 months. Should the Committee conclude that Councillor Wride had breached the code and impose a sanction then Councillor Wride would have a right of appeal to the Adjudication Panel for Wales.

Ms Cook of the Ombudsman's Office thereupon summarised the findings of the investigation undertaken and the Committee was given the opportunity to ask questions/seek clarification.

Councillor Wride was thereupon invited to address the Committee in her defence of the findings and the Committee was given the opportunity to ask questions/ seek clarification.

At this point in the proceedings it was proposed and seconded, pursuant to Section 100A(4) of the Local Government Act 1972, that the press and public be excluded from the meeting for the reason that, if they were present, it was likely that there would be disclosure to them of exempt information as defined in Paragraph 16 of Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 namely



information in respect of which a claim to legal professional privilege could be maintained in legal proceedings.

UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED to retire into private session to enable the Committee to consider exempt information as defined in Paragraph 16 of Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972.

The representatives from the Ombudsman's Office and Councillor Wride duly left the meeting and the webcasting of the meeting was paused. Following the conclusion of those deliberations, the Ombudsman's representatives and Councillor Wride re-joined the meeting and the webcast was re-commenced.

#### Decision as to breach

Based upon the undisputed facts in this case the Committee felt that a reasonable member of the public would consider that Councillor Wride's conduct had brought her office of Councillor and her Council into disrepute and therefore was satisfied that Councillor Wride had breached Paragraph 6(1)(a) of the Code of Conduct. This was especially given that at the time of the breach Councillor Wride held a senior position in the Council as Mayor and her conduct resulted in a criminal conviction.

At this point in the proceedings, in order for the Committee to receive confidential personal information from Cllr Wride to enable it to deliberate upon what sanction, if any, should be imposed, it was

UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED to retire into private session to enable the Committee to consider exempt information as defined in Paragraph 16 of Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972.

The webcasting of the meeting was therefore paused whilst that confidential personal information was provided to the committee

The committee then retired to consider what sanction, if any, it would impose and Cllr Wride and the Ombudsman's representative again left the meeting.

Having made its decision the private session was concluded and the Ombudsman's representatives and Councillor Wride re-joined the meeting and the webcast was re-commenced so that the decision as to sanction could be given.

#### Decision as to sanction

In considering the sanction to be imposed upon Councillor Wride for her breach of the Code the Committee had regard to the representations made on behalf of the Ombudsman and those made by Councillor Wride.

The Committee followed the five stage process set out in guidance issued by the Adjudication Panel for Wales.



Having considered all the evidence and representations, the Committee

RESOLVED that it would be appropriate and proportionate to suspend Councillor Wride for a period of 2 months and that she should undertake Code of Conduct training within the next six months.

"The Standards Committee will need to balance the public interest in preventing members with prejudicial interests from taking part in decisions, against the public interest in decisions being taken by a reasonably representative group of members of the authority"

## **DISPENSATIONS GUIDANCE**

## Introduction

During the meeting of the committee in June 2022 dispensation requests were considered in relation to

- Farming and Agricultural matters generally
- The provision of social care services in Carmarthenshire and across the Southwest Wales Region

In both cases dispensations were granted to speak/make written representations but not vote and were subject to certain caveats.

Committee members have asked for further guidance in relation to such dispensation requests given how wide ranging they can be in nature, scope, and effect.

## Legislation and Guidance

There appears to be no specific legislative provision or statutory guidance on this precise issue. Regulations prescribe the grounds upon which a dispensation can be granted and these ae set out in the dispensation application form. The executive summary in the covering report references the relevant legislation and the one paragraph of the Ombudsman's guidance that may be considered relevant.

## Basic Principles

The first point the committee needs to remember is that any dispensation only applies where the member in question has a personal and prejudicial interest in an item of council business which would otherwise prevent their participation. If the member does not have that interest in the item of business, then they can participate fully irrespective of what the dispensation says.

So, taking the farming dispensation as an example, if the item of council of business is a motion on notice calling on supermarkets to only sell Welsh lamb, a dairy or arable farmer may well not have a personal and prejudicial interest in that motion (as it does not relate to or be likely to

affect their farming business) and will therefore be able to participate fully (including vote) without having to rely on their dispensation.

In contrast a sheep farmer would have a personal and prejudicial interest in that motion and therefore would have to rely on their dispensation to participate.

Invariably there will be individual councillors who fall between these two ends of the spectrum. Councillors who rent out land to sheep farmers for example would have to carefully consider their personal position in such a situation and may have to rely upon their dispensation to participate even though the main part of their personal farming activity is not sheep farming.

The second point the committee needs to remember is that in considering a dispensation application it is conducting a balancing exercise. As the Ombudsman's guidance says

"The Standards Committee will need to balance the public interest in preventing members with prejudicial interests from taking part in decisions, against the public interest in decisions being taken by a reasonably representative group of members of the authority"

This will invariably need to be determined on a case-by-case basis and it is quite reasonable for the committee to conclude in a particular case that the balance of the public interest is in favour of allowing a member to speak/make written representations but not vote. It would appear from the wording of the Ombudsman's guidance that a factor in the committee's conclusions would be whether there would still be a 'reasonably representative group of members' available to make a decision, if the dispensation application were refused or only granted to speak/make written representations. What constitutes a 'reasonably representative group of members' will depend on the facts of each application.

## Alternative Approach

The practice of granting broad dispensations of the nature outlined above is relatively new, the first being granted in 2017 because of a motion on notice at full council. Since then, similar broad dispensations have been granted on 6 occasions, including the 2 granted at the

meeting in June. These dispensations have related to a wide variety of interests and to councillors across the political spectrum.

In line with advice given to councillors at code of conduct training sessions, members have been encouraged to be pro-active in seeking dispensations where they consider that they are likely to have a personal and prejudicial interest at some point in upcoming council business.

The alternative approach would be to expect members to apply for a dispensation each time an item of council business arises in which they have a prejudicial interest. However quite often members will not have sufficient warning that a particular item of business will be on the agenda to enable them to apply for a dispensation.

Taking the recent social care services dispensation as an example a motion on notice on this subject need only be submitted to the Chief Executive 7 clear working days before the meeting at which it is to be considered. The meeting agenda and reports must then be published at least 3 clear days before the meeting.

The first the member may know of the motion would be when they receive the agenda for the meeting. Clearly it would not be possible for that member to apply for a dispensation and have their request considered by the committee within 3 days.

Requiring the member to apply for a dispensation each time a specific item of council business arose regarding the provision of social care services (and in which he considered he had a prejudicial interest) would therefore have the practical effect of excluding him from the consideration of such business even though, in line with the Ombudsman's guidance, the committee might feel that the balance of public interest was in favour of allowing him to participate on that occasion.

## Conclusion

The Committee's annual report has in recent years contained the statement that

"The Committee continues to approach each application with a presumption in favour of granting a dispensation wherever practicable, <u>particularly in relation to granting a dispensation to speak only."</u> [my emphasis]

The Committee has tended to draw a distinction between dispensations to speak only and dispensations to speak and vote and this approach is fully justified provided they consider each application on its on individual merits.

Where the members of the committee consider the balance of public interest lies in each individual case is a matter for them to decide based on the particular facts of that case.

Granting broad dispensations of the sort given in June has the effect of enabling councillors to participate in council business which they may otherwise be excluded from in practice due to having insufficient time to make a specific dispensation application.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY STANDARDS COMMITTEE 21/11/22

## DISPENSATION APPLICATION BY GORSLAS COMMUNITY COUNCILLORS S D MARTIN, R JAMES, N LEWIS, E GOLDSMITH

A dispensation application has been received from the Clerk to Gorslas Community Council on behalf 4 councillors who are governors of schools within the administrative area of the community council.

The application is to both speak and vote.

The Councillors have a personal interest in council business relating to the schools of which they are governors by virtue of paragraph 10(2)(a)(ix)(aa) of the members code of conduct.

The exemption in paragraph 12(2)(a)(iv) of the code relating to school governors would not apply if the council business related to the specific school of which the councillor was a governor.

The application is made on the ground that to enable the councillors to participate in council business relating to their individual schools would not damage public confidence in the conduct of that business.

The attached application sets out in detail the nature of the interests and the basis upon which dispensation is sought.

Committee members should also be aware that dispensations to speak and vote were granted to 7 Gorslas councillors (including 1 of the current applicants) in respect of the same interest in 2016. The Community Council is not involved directly in the running of schools. The County Council, as well as residents, do however refer issues related to any proposed changes to the schools' network affecting the area or issues related to the admission of pupils to the schools and or lack of suitable accommodation, facilities or provision.

Additionally, issues arise at Council meetings which relate to local schools and in particular currently the new Gorslas C.P. school which is re-locating to Gorslas Park. The Community Council is negotiating an agreement with the Governing Body in relation to the use of certain facilities outside school times and days.

At Cefneithin Park the local primary school is given free use of the MUGA and of the adjoining park, both of which are owned by the Community Council to provide physical exercise and team games for the pupils.

It is likely that operational, and management issues will arise during the course of the next five years where there will be an interaction with the Governing Body specifically in relation to these arrangements.

Having members of the Community Council who are also members of the Governing Body has proved particularly beneficial in terms of shared problem areas in the three parks. Dog fouling is one such issue and through the offices of the members of the two bodies it has been possible to agree an action plan which will commence in September, 2022 and include both bodies as well as the County Council.

The partnership type arrangement also made the process of consulting with the local schools to obtain the views of the pupils in relation to the type and nature of play equipment they would like to see in the parks in the future. That information was used as part of the tender process and also to support application for financial assistance.

The Community Council is also conscious of the fact that a number of its members volunteered to be nominated as representatives of the Council on the Governing Bodies of the schools as they have an active interest and commitment in education.

It would seem punitive, and a disincentive, to then prohibit them from discussions and decisions relating to those schools given their desire to serve the community and the school.

The Community Council feels there is a benefit in allowing members in such a position to be able to contribute, take part and vote in relation to issues affecting those schools.

It is believed that the overall balance of public interest is best served by such an arrangement and that there is a sufficient safeguard in that the vast majority of Councillors do not have any formal involvement with the school.

The Community Council therefore respectfully requests that consideration be given to retaining the current arrangement



A dispensation application has been received from the Clerk to Gorslas Community Council on behalf 5 councillors who are members of 2 different welfare associations within the administrative area of the community council.

The application is to both speak and vote.

The Councillors have a personal interest in council business relating to these welfare associations by virtue of paragraph 10(2)(a)(ix)(ee) of the members code of conduct.

The application is made on the ground that to enable the councillors to participate in council business relating to their respective welfare associations would not damage public confidence in the conduct of that business and that the interest relates to a voluntary organisation in which the councillor has a management role and that the councillor has no other personal interest.

The Welfare Associations have played a significant role in the development of the parks which the Community Council own and operate and play a consultative role in obtaining the views of residents on proposed changes to the park or any issues residents may have with difficulties arising from the operation of the parks.

The Community Councillors who are also members of the local Welfare Associations contribute to the work of the Community Council considerably through the pooling and sharing of their ongoing knowledge of the activities, aims and actions of the local organisations.

The full Council consists of 15 Councillors, five from each of the three wards. There is also a Sub Committee (it is a General Purpose Sub Committee and deals with any matters delegated to it by full Council – there are no other committees or sub-committees). One member from each ward sits on the Sub Committee and each ward also appoints a further member, as part of a mentoring and development programme, to serve in the role of observer.

The balance of membership of Councillors who are also members of Welfare Associations has changed following the elections in May 2022. It currently stands at 33% of the total membership.

Whilst that is shy of the 50% threshold indicated as a stated reason for applying for dispensation if a third of the total membership was not able to participate in the discussion and decision-making process then it would impact on the quality of the decision-making process and leave the views of a significant number of electors unrepresented.

The Community Council is of the view that the current arrangement works well, facilitates better informed decision making and that the balance is such that it allows for input from the local members who are also members of the Welfare Association but with the majority of members not being members of that particular local welfare association or indeed any association.

A recent practical example resulted in the Gorslas Welfare Association donating £6k to assist in the process of purchasing new play equipment for Gorslas Park. The role of the Community Council members who were also members of the Gorslas Welfare Association was key in facilitating the arrangement.

Changing the arrangement would provide a poorer service for each community and work against the efficient delivery and co-ordination of services in the area.

Members kindly seek the permission of the County Council to continue the current arrangement and grant dispensation for the relevant members.



This was however subject to a caveat that it does not apply to council business that relates directly to the specific farm or agricultural land or activity which gives rise to the councillor's personal interest.

Advice has been given by the Monitoring Officer that this caveat means that this previous dispensation would not permit the relevant members to participate in the debate on this particular motion and therefore that a further, more specific dispensation, should be requested.

#### General information in support of the request

Agriculture makes up an important part of the economy of the County and members of the public working in the industry, or whose families are directly connected with the industry, make up a significant part of the population of many parts of Carmarthenshire.

Many of the functions of the Council relate to or directly affect the farming industry. Decisions taken by elected members relating to farming matters can have a significant impact not just upon individual farms, but also upon the wider agricultural sector and the communities that they are a key part of.

If Councillors who have a personal and prejudicial interest in farming related decisions are unable to speak, not only would farming communities in the County be denied democratic representation when such decisions are made but also those Councillors who do not have such an interest would be denied the benefit of their expert knowledge.

Public confidence in the conduct of the Council's business would not be damaged by allowing these Councillors to speak in any debate or make written representations on farming related matters if any dispensation were to be caveated in the way suggested below.

The 14 applicants represent just over a third of their Plaid Cymru group on the Council and their inability to participate in any farming or agricultural matters would distort the political balance of the Council to such an extent that it could affect the outcome of any vote on the particular motion.

Some of these Councillors represent constituencies that are heavily affected by agricultural decisions and policies in terms of economy, employment and language etc. As such it is felt that it unfairly disadvantages those constituencies where their elected Councillor is denied a vote on such issues.

All applicants (apart from Cllrs. Davies Evans, Andrew Davies, Bryan Davies and Hazel Evans) have previously been granted dispensation to speak and make written representations (but not vote) in respect of these in respect of farming and agriculture generally, most recently in June 2022, and before this in 2017, 2018 and 2019.

However the June 2022 dispensation is subject to the caveat that it does not apply to council business that relates directly to the specific farm or agricultural land or activity which gives rise to the councillor's personal interest. Advice has been received from the Monitoring Officer that this caveat means that this previous dispensation would not therefore permit the relevant members to participate in the debate on this particular motion as the motion asks Welsh Government to review Tb testing procedures and all the Councillors above either have cattle on their respective holdings or have family which farm cattle.

Therefore, we require further dispensation which allows the mentioned Councillors to speak and vote on this specific issue in which they are experts. They all live with Tb testing on a bimonthly basis or at best every 6 months. The Technical Advice Group which has been set up by Welsh Government is currently looking at Terms of Reference and therefore now is the opportune time to influence and provide expert representation. Tb testing affects all agricultural holdings which have cattle and constituents from all Wards need to have representations from their respective knowledgeable Councillors.

# CODE OF CONDUCT COMPLIANCE BY TOWN AND COMMUNITY COUNCILLORS 2021-2022

In accordance with the previous practice of the Committee letters were sent to all Town and Community Councils in April 2022 asking them to provide information regarding code of conduct compliance during the preceding municipal year (1st April 2021 to 31st March 2022).

Reminder letters were sent in May 2022 to those councils that had not responded and in July 2022 legal department staff also telephoned the remaining councils who had not provided data. As at the beginning of August only 6 out of 72 Councils had not responded and arrangements were made for those 6 councils to again be contacted by telephone.

Due to the request by committee members that the data be presented in a more accessible way than in the past, officers have utilised Snap Survey software to collate the responses received and present them in the attached report. Sheet 1 sets out the responses to all 3 questions in table form, sheet 2 deals with declarations of interest and sheet 3 code training. If members agree, it is suggested that for next year's data exercise councils be sent a link to the Snap Survey and that they complete the online questionnaire themselves.

Members will note that the survey does not address the issue of Code of Conduct complaints.

Data provided by the Public Services Ombudsman for Wales shows that during the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022 a total of 4 code of conduct complaints were <u>concluded</u> against Town and Community Councillors from Carmarthenshire none of which required any action to be taken against the councillors concerned.

These figures do not however include complaints made and/or investigated <u>but not concluded</u> during the period of this report.





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
