1. DECLARATIONS OF PERSONAL INTEREST

There were no declarations of personal interest.

2. DECISION RECORD - 18TH MARCH 2022

RESOLVED that the decision record of the meeting held on the 18th March, 2022 be signed as a correct record.

3. NON-RESIDENTIAL CHARGING 2023-24

The Cabinet Member considered a report detailing the potential impact, and effect, of changes to charges for non-residential services and the need for charges in Carmarthenshire to increase in order to continue to maximise income.

To work towards full cost recovery for 2023-24, and to align rates with other Local Authorities in Wales, it was proposed to increase non-residential charges for hourly charged services from £18.00 to £20.00 (11.11%) and Day Care and Adult Placement charges from £17.60 to £19.55 (11.08%).

It was noted that the scale of charges for 2023-24, in most cases is significantly less than the cost of provision, however increasing charges would not necessarily increase income for this year because the amount anyone can pay is controlled by the current Welsh Government "Cap" and Financial Assessment. It was however recognised that there may be a small marginal increase of income from the inflationary uplift applied to the full cost, small packages of care.

RESOLVED that Carmarthenshire increase its Non-Residential charges for hourly charged services by inflation from £18.00 to £20.00 (11.11%) and Day Care and Adult Placement sessional charges from £17.60 to £19.55 (11.08%) in an attempt to recover as much revenue as possible within the rules set down by Welsh Government for 2023 - 24, and to align rates with other local authorities in Wales, and to move closer to regional Local Authorities.

LOCAL AUTHORITY RESIDENTIAL CARE STANDARD CHARGE FOR 2023-2024

RECOMMENDATIONS / KEY DECISIONS REQUIRED:

That the Standard Charge for Local Authority Older People residential care homes be increased from £718.56 to £840.60 for mainstream beds and from £935.60 to £990.85 for dementia beds.

For residents placed by this authority into our own Local Authority Homes the effective date for the new rates is 26th June 2023. For those residents placed in our homes by other Local Authorities the effective date for the new charges to those authorities is the 10th of April 2023.

REASONS:

Adults in residential accommodation are required to contribute to the cost of their care. Where they have sufficient resources, they are required to pay the full cost of their accommodation, known as the Standard Charge, which is calculated annually based on the full cost to the authority of providing the accommodation.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY CABINET MEMBERS DECISION MEETING FOR HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES 8TH JUNE 2023

LOCAL AUTHORITY RESIDENTIAL CARE STANDARD CHARGE FOR 2023-2024

There are currently 7 homes with a total of 248 beds in Carmarthenshire County Council's own residential homes. The overall budgeted costs for running the Authority's residential homes together with the number of beds available and the occupancy levels are the determining factors in calculating the annual Standard Charge.

For 2023-24 there has been no change in the number of Local Authority beds. Inflationary increases will be significant in several key areas in the Residential Care Homes budgets: Pay costs are projected to increase by 18% compared to the projections this time last year, though the 2023-2024 pay award has not yet been formally agreed; premises maintenance costs are anticipated to increase by approx 10%; utility bills are projected to increase by 131% and food costs by 18%.

As a result, the charge for mainstream beds will increase by 16.98% and dementia beds by 16.59%.

However, due to market position compared to the private sector, the department are proposing to cap the dementia beds rate to 5.91% i.e., at £990.85 instead of the full cost recovery rate of £1,090.85. This will ensure the bed rates are more comparable with the private sector, and this may result in more income from full cost placements.

The financial impact of capping the dementia bed rate would be approx. £20k less income during 2023-2024, as there are very few residents that pay the full rate due to their financial assessment.

Recommendation

The Standard Charge for Local Authority Older People residential care homes be increased from £718.56 to £840.60 for mainstream beds and from £935.60 to £990.85 for dementia beds.

3. Finance

The Standard Charge has been calculated based on the full cost to the authority of providing the accommodation for mainstream beds. For dementia beds, the proposal is to cap the rate at £100 per week less than full cost recovery. The financial impact on 2023-2024 income is approx £20k shortfall as few residents pay the full rate due to their financial assessment.

5. Risk Management Issues

As there continues to be a cost differential between the Local Authority and the Private Sector this could lead to a shift in placements from Local Authority homes into the Private Sector.
