10 Towns Programme Capital Fund

Purpose

To consider an application for funding submitted as part of the Ten Towns Programme.

Background

The aim of the 10 Towns Programme is to increase the resilience and future growth of Carmarthenshire's rural market towns and their surrounding areas.

The Authority has committed £1m capital funding to support the respective towns to take forward some of the capital aspirations identified within their economic growth plans. This was approved by Executive Board on 21st June 2021. Subsequently, further funding has been secured via the Shared Prosperity Fund Rural Anchor Programme to support the realisation of the town's priority projects.

Llandeilo Town Council has already received Cabinet Member approval in October 2023 for phase 1 of their Ten Towns project which included the development of a bike pump track as a visitor attraction to the town located at Parc Le Conquet.

Since the project completed in early March, a great deal of interest has been shown via their online presence with over 1000 website visits to date and extremely positive feedback received from users.

This application is for the second and final phase of their Ten Towns project which aims to further enhance the new attraction in the town by providing a dedicated parking area, fencing of the pump track area and purchase of street furniture at the site following feedback gained to date.

The application has been assessed and considered by the internal Funding panel before being presented to Cabinet member for final decision.

Application for consideration:

Llandelio Town Council

Total project costs: £72,391 Amount Requested: £72,391

Llandeilo Town Council is the lead applicant for the development of the Ten Towns project in Llandeilo.



The growth plan team prioritised the development of a cycling tourist attraction at Parc Le Conquet as their priority project, linking with the area's cycling offer and proposed Tywi Valley cycle path development. With the first phase of this project now complete and the pump track fully operational for several weeks, this application for support centres around completing the Pump track development to ensure it has the maximum impact to benefit the town and delivers a high-quality attraction that attracts visitors from afar.

This final phase of the project will see the following elements being developed:

- Designated parking area for visitors
- Installation of picnic benches, bins and street furniture to increase visitor dwell time
- Bike repair stations
- Fencing of pump track

No planning permission is required and landowners permission has been granted.

The application for support aligns with the Ten towns programme and will complete what is already proving to be a successful visitor attraction to the town.

Project Delivery timeline

The project will begin as soon as full approval is granted. Project must be fully complete by end of December 2024 in line with Shared Prosperity Funding period.

Outputs to be achieved

M2 of outdoor space created for dining/events/markets/ parking

50x30m2

Recommendation

To approve a grant request of £72,391 from the Ten Towns Capital Shared Prosperity Fund.

The Ten Towns programme provides on opportunity for rural market towns to create new economic benefit and opportunities developed as a recommendation from the Moving Rural Carmarthenshire Forward Plan.

The above is aligned with the county's existing strategies and plans including the Local Investment Plan for Carmarthenshire, Economic Recovery Plan, Local Innovation Strategy, Wellbeing Assessment, and the South-West Wales Regional Economic Delivery Plan and Corporate Strategy.

The project will also deliver against the Authority's Vision Statement as a key priority in 'Making our communities and environment, healthy, safe and prosperous' places to live.

The Programme will support the objectives of the Wellbeing & Future Generations Act by targeting interventions which aim to ensure that the Welsh speaking communities of the County remain vibrant and sustainable communities.

Risk Management Issues

At a project level, a risk register will be maintained together with appropriate mitigation measures. The Rural Anchor Team who are responsible for administering the funds will closely monitor progress of the project individual awards. Where a lack of progress is being made,



applicants will need to provide clarification as to how they will be able to deliver against the original approved amount. As a last resort this may mean suspension of a project mid delivery.
