Purpose:

To approve financial support for Llanelli Shopmobility for August 2022 to August 2023

Reasons:

Shopmobility is one of many initiatives being encouraged by the Authority to support Llanelli town and is an important element of ensuring access to shops, businesses and services within Llanelli are inclusive and cater for those with mobility impairments.

Shopmobility provides for hire facilities such as wheelchairs and mobility scooters for shoppers and visitors to use within the town.

The grant is funded from the County Council's Community Transport element of the Bus Services Support Grant provided by Welsh Government.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

CABINET MEMBER DECISION MEETING FOR TRANSPORT, WASTE AND INFRASTRUCTURE SERVICES 30TH NOVEMBER 2022

LLANELLI SHOPMOBILITY

The County Council has supported the Llanelli Shopmobility scheme since 2011. The current funding is an annual arrangement renewed each August.

The Llanelli scheme provides a valuable service for those with mobility impairments to access the town and is important in helping the town's post-covid regeneration.

The scheme is mainly reliant on the County Council's financial support and an annual grant is normally provided which is funded from the County Council's Community Transport element of the Bus Services Support Grant.

In recognition of increased operational pressures it is proposed that the grant is increased by 4% for the period making the annual grant payable in 2022/23 a total of £15,236.

Shopmobility supports the County Council's updated *Corporate Strategy 2018-2023* which includes specific recognition of the importance of inclusive mobility in:

- Providing integrated and affordable access for businesses, for residents and visitors
 can stimulate economic development, reductions in deprivation and social exclusion
 and an increase in well-being.
- Sustaining access to services will deliver improvements in health and well-being for all sections of the community e.g. that includes walking, cycling, passenger and road transport.

The Council has set aside funding to fund a further twelve months support.

In light of the current dynamic geopolitical and economic environment it may be necessary to provide additional support to Shopmobility to sustain operations during the period. This will be subject to further liaison as necessary and a further Cabinet paper if required.

Should there be any surplus funding at the end of their financial year it would be relatively modest and reinvested in supporting the improvement of the service.

Recommendation: It is recommended that a grant be provided to support Shopmobility in Llanelli from August 2022 to August 2023 of £15,236.
