People are changing things for the better here in town and the community and your behaviour won't be tolerated in the market or Tyisha, your antisocial druggie friends will be kicked out of town.

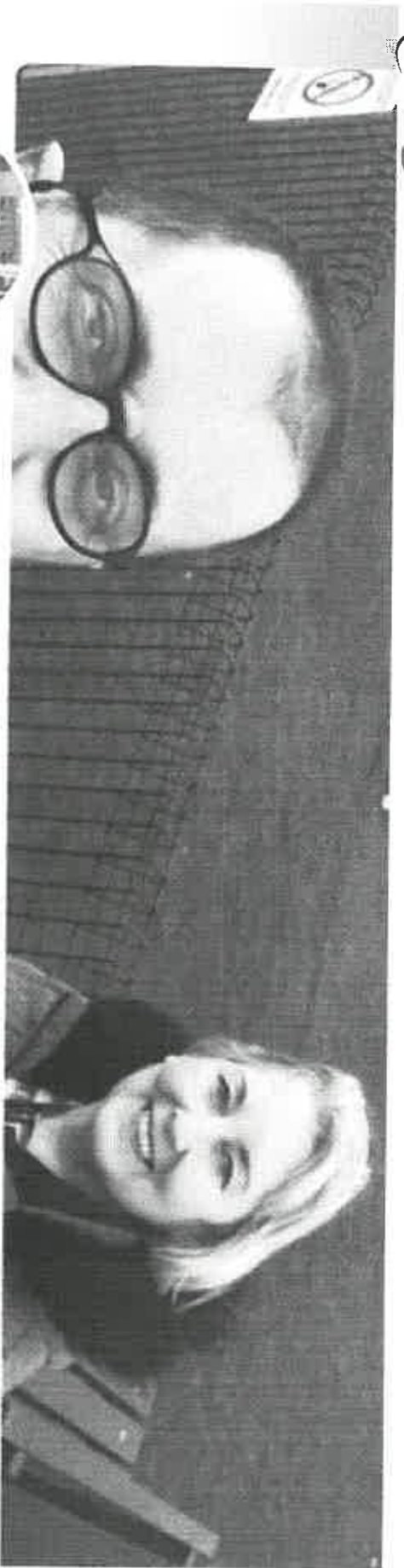

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT OFFICER'S REPORT

The Town Council has a legal duty under the Well-being of Future Generations Act 2015 to ensure it takes consideration of the Act in all its activities and services. The Town Council Community Development Service supports the delivery of the objectives set out within both the Act and the Carmarthenshire Well-being strategy through its work in Llanelli with Community Organisations and key Partners.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND UPDATE

(1) UPDATES AND ACTIVITIES

The Town Council continues to support projects that can be delivered safely within the Covid guidelines for Wales, updated information on these are as follows:

- **Connect 2021** – As part of the Connect 2021 project the Town Council has developed a dog fouling education and social media project, a Young Traders project and the Agen and Llanelli school link up project, all due to take place in the new year.
- **Community Partnership Mind Our Future Llanelli** - Whilst the Lottery funding application was not successful, the partnership met recently to discuss ways forward, engaging with young people and possible joint funded projects to support young people 11-21 years of age.
- **Food and Young Trader Market** - The successful event was held on the 20th of November in the Town Centre. It saw a number of food producers and young traders coming together. More Young Traders market events are being planned for the new year. Some feedback received from the young traders that took part in the event:

“It was a great pitch, yes, it was a successful day, when are the next dates please?”

“The stall went amazing. Thank you. I really enjoyed and it was so good to see the town packed with local people and other businesses too. It was a great turn out!”

“Yes I would like to attend future events, I am interested in doing another one for the 4th of December for the reindeer parade.”

“The market was brilliant, everyone was so friendly and helpful. The market was busy and I had lots of customers, which was brilliant! I would definitely be interested in attending future events.”

- **Llanelli Community Partnership** - are planning several community activities through December to support the community. A food parcel project is planned for the homeless communities, a Christmas card school project and a community Sing along, all are welcome.
- **Carmarthenshire Toy Box appeal** - delivered by Carmarthenshire Youth Service is currently underway, it is expected that a number of families will be supported in Llanelli. The Town Council has donated £1,000 of toys and gifts to the appeal.

(2) LLANELLI PHARMABEE PROJECT

The Llanelli Pharmabee project is a partnership between Penrhos and Pentip schools, Pentre Awel, Llanelli Town Council, the National Botanical Gardens of Wales and Cardiff University. Whilst in its early stage of planning it's expected that two honeybee hives will be provided along with beekeeper volunteer managers, training and creation of new green spaces planting areas in and around the two schools in Llanelli. Further information will follow.

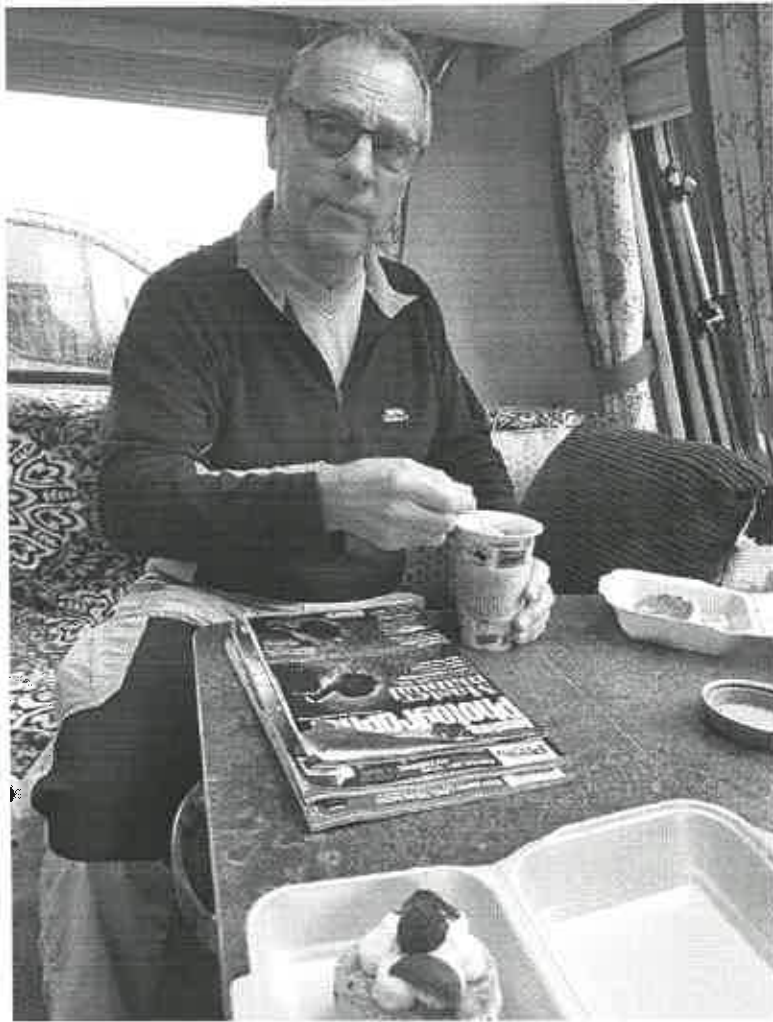
