WG Direct Food Support Fund

1. BRIEF SUMMARY OF PURPOSE OF REPORT.

The Authority has been providing support to foodbanks via various Welsh Government funding initiatives over recent months.

The Authority has recently been allocated a further £53,076.00 through the Welsh Government Direct Food Support Fund, the aim of which is to support an increased number of people facing food poverty.

With this funding, along with slippage from previous rounds, the Authority is seeking to make available additional funding to foodbanks across the County that are helping to tackle food poverty within the county. The fund will be administered by the Bureau within Economic Development and will provide support with the purchase of additional supplies of good quality food and essential goods via Castell Howell Foods.

In order to identify demand, the Foodbanks were contacted in July 2023 and invited to submit an application, setting out support required between September to December 2023. In total, the following 16 Foodbanks were contacted and invited to submit applications for funding:

- Salvation Army
- Xcel Foodbank
- Llandysul Foodbank
- Newcastle Emlyn Foodbank
- Tyisha Foodbank
- CETMA
- Antioch Centre
- Llwynhendy Foodbank
- Myrtle House Foodbank
- Ammanford Foodbank
- Cwmamman Pantry
- Llandeilo Foodbank (Bocs Bwyd)



- Llandovery Foodbank
- Whitland Foodbank
- Llannon/Tumble Foodbank
- Christ Church Foodbank

Subsequently, 10 Foodbanks submitted an application by the deadline.

The applications received were assessed by the Bureau's grants panel, taking into consideration the number of people they are currently supporting, future numbers, along with how they plan to target the most in need. As part of the assessment process, each application was considered based on the monetary value requested, divided by the numbers of individuals supported over a four-month period.

This exercise identified an average cost per head that was used as a comparison when determining the maximum grant awarded. These ranged from £3.50 per head to £10 per head which is due to varying reasons such as access to donations and support from other sources.

Given that support is required swiftly, we have relied on the detail provided by the foodbank in terms of numbers of people accessing the foodbank and the level of resource they need to support existing demand. The Authority will enter into an agreement with the respective foodbanks which we will monitor on a regular basis.

Based on the assessment undertaken, it is recommended that funding is awarded to the following foodbanks to the value of £56,000 in respect of **10 individual** applications:

- 1) Tyisha Foodbank £8,000
- 2) Christ Church Foodbank £8,000
- 3) CETMA £4.000
- 4) Llanelli Foodbank (Myrtle House) £10,000
- 5) Llwynhendy Foodbank £10,000
- 6) Salvation Army £1,000
- 7) Cwmamman Pantry £5,500
- 8) Llannon Pantry £6,500
- 9) Llandovery Foodbank £2,500
- 10)Banc Bwyd CNE £500 (up to a maximum £1,000 should the need arise).

In addition, we received a late submission from Ammanford Foodbank. Due to the demand, we propose that that this application is also considered by the Bureau team and that delegated authority is granted to the Head of Regeneration, Digital and Policy to make the decision on the application, subject to available funding, in line with consistent levels of funding with other foodbanks.

There are no other options. The funding has been allocated to Carmarthenshire to support an increased number of people facing food poverty.
