Applicant	St Clears RFC
Project Description	St. Clears Rugby Football Club was established in 1985 and provides sports and social activities to the wider community within West Carmarthenshire.
	St. Clears RFC has developed through a dedicated volunteer base, a strong community club. The key to the sustainability of the club for both juniors & seniors rely on the services and recruitment of various personnel all with one objective in mind, to promote and develop the game of rugby within the community in order to encourage maximum participation and enjoyment at all levels.
	The club is proud of its tradition for growing and developing local talent, many of which have gained higher accolades in various national age grade teams.
	This project is for phase 4 of the club's development to expand the ground floor existing changing room facility to incorporate additional changing rooms, kitchen area, physiotherapy session room and extension to first floor function room
	<ul> <li>Presently they are limited to two changing rooms, which are clearly inadequate to meet the needs of their entire mini, junior and senior teams.</li> <li>Within 12 months there will be duplicate fixtures on Saturdays to include Senior and Youth.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Despite endeavours to stagger fixtures on Sundays, there is often 10 teams (home and away teams) needing to use the facilities which are no longer fit for purpose as per the WRU guidelines.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Their referee, first aid and physiotherapy facilities are no longer sufficient to meet the expanding needs.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The proposed development will include, a kitchen facility enabling the club to become self sufficient in preparing and serving player meals and providing the opportunity for the junior sections to create revenue through the provision of a club shop, providing teas, coffees, snacks, etc for the community.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Upgraded facilities fit for purpose for the next decade.</li> <li>Safeguard investment to date and ensure that all players at all levels have the ability to develop their skills by participating in the game of rugby football.</li> <li>To be a responsible community partner.</li> <li>To promote a health and wellbeing through participation in sport.</li> <li>To develop community engagement at all levels, players, volunteers, coaches, referees, community in general, etc.</li> <li>To deliver a sustainable legacy as a rugby club of choice for players, members supporters and sponsors.</li> </ul>
	Close links have been developed with the town's primary school enabling them to attract a wider player base and the club management team are maintaining and developing new contacts with local schools, in conjunction with WRU development officers, promoting rugby themed festivals and regional match day visits to the Scarlet's.
	St. Clears RFC has entered into a formal lease agreement with Carmarthenshire County Council for the use of the playing fields for a further 21 year period.
	This project is an opportunity to utilise enhanced facilities for events, festivals etc, for the club, the community, and the surrounding community such as Bancyfelin, Laugharne, Llanboidy, Meidrim, Pendine and Trelech.

Project Title	Restoration Project
Applicant	St Michael's Church – Golden Grove
Project Description	St. Michael's Church is located three miles South-West of Llandeilo, within the Towy Valley, itself designated as a Conservation Area, and comprises of a loose collection of some thirty dwellings. The nucleus of the village centres around St. Michael's Church and the Church Hall, formerly the Church school, which are set back from a small triangular grassed area which borders onto the road. Both are grade 11 listed buildings from August 1999, Cadw Building ID: 22180 and the church is a fine example of a small church built in the decorated style of the gothic revival. Architecturally, the church includes a nave with a small timber belfry and spire near the west end, a slightly lower chancel and a porch and transept with vestry on the north side. The building is exceptionally well detailed on all elevations, the stonework includes mullion and transom windows, weathered string course, coped gables on moulded and doubled weathered skew stones. The Church has been fully sustainable and has maintained and internally refurbished the Church Hall, with kitchen facilities and toilets to DDA standards, for the community and increased users of the facility, through their own funds raised.
	This project is for <b>essential repairs to the church</b> as a result of the recent Quinqennial inspection report, to include immediate works to the electrical system, replacement boiler, repair and re- pointing work around boundary walls, roof repairs, replacement French drain, renewal of left hand side timber floor bearers, redecoration, churchyard clearance, organ investigation and trimming and shaping of the largest tree within the churchyard. As stated by the residents Golden Grove is a very pretty conservation village and this project would keep it aesthetically so.
