<p><b>Swansea City Football Club Kicks Force-wide project</b></p> <p>The PCC approved the allocation of £300k over a 3-year period for the roll out of the SCFC kicks project across the Dyfed-Powys area, allocated from the Commissioner’s reserve fund.</p> <p>This was following a successful pilot project run by SCFC Trust in Seaside and Pembroke Dock where we saw the trust develop and run several football sessions / training sessions for children in the community, targeting hard to reach groups . <p><b>Section 22A collaboration agreement for the National Police Coordination Centre</b></p> <p>The PCC and CC agreed to sign the section 22A collaboration agreement for the National Police Coordination Centre pending final due diligence checks.</p> <p>A single Section 22A Agreement between all seven regional forces was required to form the legal basis for collaborative working.</p>	<p>6<sup>th</sup> Jan 2022</p>
<p><b>Delta Power Group</b></p> <p>The PCC approved that a contract of £490,000 be awarded to Delta Power Group for the provision of a cabined rigid hull inflatable boat.</p> <p>The PCC’s Chief Finance Officer and CC’s Director of Finance had considered the tender and recommended it be approved. <p><b>Estates function</b></p> <p>The PCC decided that the estates function would be transferred back to the direction and control of the Chief Constable. This decision was made predominantly due to the fact that the requirements for the estates are operational in nature. Governance arrangements are in place to ensure the PCC retains line of sight and is in a position to scrutinise the function. Any fundamental decisions relating to the estates will be made at Policing Board following discussions between the PCC and Chief Constable.</p>	<p>6<sup>th</sup> Jan 2022</p>
<p><b>Independent Custody Visitor (ICV) Scheme to return to calls only</b></p> <p>As a result of developments with the Coronavirus pandemic and advice issued from the Government, Dyfed-Powys Police made the decision from the 18<sup>th</sup> of March 2020 to postpone all non-essential visits to Police sites in order to safeguard the resilience of policing in Dyfed-Powys, and in particular the sensitive sites of Police Stations.</p> <p>On the 12<sup>th</sup> of January 2022 it was decided that due to an increase in Covid-19 related sickness / isolation absences in custody, which has resulted in the need to restrict visitors to custody suites to only those absolutely necessary, the ICV scheme should return to ICV calls only at present. <p><b>ICV scheme to return to physical visits into custody</b></p> <p>The PCC approved the decision for the ICV scheme to revert back to physical visits from the 31<sup>st</sup> of January 2022. <p><b>Information sharing between Dyfed-Powys Police and the OPCC</b></p> <p>Section 3.7.6 of the Joint Corporate Governance Framework states that: "In order to enable the PCC to exercise the functions of their office effectively, they will need access to information, officers, and staff within their force area. The PCC and CC will share information where appropriate to support each other in exercising their functions; where this relates to the sharing of personal data, such sharing will be in accordance with the requirements of the DPA and UKGDPR as appropriate. Access to information must not be unreasonably withheld, as set out in Section 19 of the Policing Protocol Order 2011. An Information Sharing Agreement (ISA) safeguards the processes around regular sharing of personal information between the PCC and CC."</p> <p>The PCC and CC agreed that subject to appropriate business processes and risk mitigations, unredacted Force information would be shared with the OPCC volunteers for the purposes of scrutiny exercises.</p>	<p>2<sup>nd</sup> Feb 2022</p>
<p><b>ICVs to commence the Anti-rip Suit Custody Record Reviewing Pilot</b></p> <p>The PCC approved the decision for the ICV scheme to recommence reviewing custody records at Police Headquarters, under OPCC supervision.</p> <p>The ICV scheme supports the pilot by monitoring the use of the suits through their regular custody record reviewing exercises. The CIC approached the PCC with a funding request to develop a pilot project in Dyfed-Powys.
